**2009 TROPHY FISH OF THE YEAR PROGRAM** by John Kleban

The same seven species will continue for our 2009 Trophy Fish of the Year Program.

The rules are simple: you have to catch a fish of the above species, take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. If you have weighed in the largest fish of a particular species for the calendar year 2009, then you win the FOY trophy for that species. Note: your dues have to be paid before you catch an eligible fish.

**FLUKE IN THE MIDDLE GROUNDS** by Basil Dubrosky

On June 24 Bill Dabney and I fished the middle grounds in the bay in my boat and caught 4 Fluke over 20 inches. Bill caught the largest fish at 25 1/2 inches and 5.53 pounds. We fished the incoming tide with cloudy and rainy weather. The fish were caught on Gulp shrimp, new penny pattern on a 3/8 ounce flat head hairless orange jig. I also caught a Trigger Fish which was quite a surprise.

**FOLLOWUP ON JUNE'S SPEAKERS** by Bill Dabney

The fluke fishing techniques that our speakers, Bill Donovan and Darrin Dorris, described at our last meeting do work. I caught the bigger fluke, 26in-5.5 lbs, on a white bucktail tipped with a 3 inch Gulp, new penny shrimp while fishing with Basil Dubrosky at the Middle Grounds. We caught four fish all over 20 inches and 3 lbs.

The fish had Manta Shrimp in the stomachs. You will notice in the picture that the new penny shrimp looks very much like these large Manta Shrimp. This time of year the larger fish are in the bay so get out and get them before they go back out to the Ocean.

**FLUKE FISHING** by Vince Sibona

Saturday, June 13, 6:30 AM, we left my dock and headed out to the Little Egg Reef. On board the SEA BONA, I had with me, John Lysczarz, Jeff Barnhart and Bill Farris. It was a beautiful sunny day except when the fog rolled in late morning for about an hour. Wind was 10 knots out of the East and seas

were 2 to 3 feet. Water temperature was 65 degrees. We had a perfect drift from East to West across the entire reef diagonally. We started catching fluke as soon as we dropped our lines in the water. We had 4 keepers out of about 25 fish. Jeff had one at 20 inches that weighed in at 2.39 lbs. and one at 19 1/4 inches that weighed in at 2.29 lbs. Jeff had just started eating his favorite peanut butter and jelly sandwich on whole wheat bread when he hooked the 20 inch fluke. He had to put down the tasty sandwich to reel in the fish. I had one at 18 1/2 inches and Bill had one at 18 inches. We made 3 drifts and were still catching fluke when we drifted off the reef 1/2 to 3/4 of a mile.

## **JUNE SPEAKERS SENSATIONAL** by Ray Williams

Bill Donovan & Darren Dorris spoke to our members and guests at the June Meeting. The topic was “Fluke Fishing in Shallow Water.” Before their presentation, Bill gave us some info regarding expanded activities by NJ Angler Magazine. The magazine’s TV shows are now on NJAngler.com. In addition, NJ Angler now offers “NJ Angler University” on their website, NJAngler.com. These programs are web based seminars available for \$9.95 and are offered live.

Some of the tidbits offered by Darren & Bill at their talk are: Fluke migrate east to west in the bay in the spring. The biggest fish are caught in the bay between May & June. In the spring, Fluke like the warmest water. In targeting Fluke, look for an outgoing tide, afternoon sun, creek outflows, and channel edges adjacent to expansive shallow flats. Transitional Fluke are found through blind drifting & are moving from one feeding station to another. Stationed Fluke are positioned at key ambush locations usually in dense schools of similarly sized fish and feed very aggressively.

Fluke go deeper as the day goes on due to better light conditions. You can fish for Fluke while anchored if you look for the right places to find stationed fish. Cast your lures & present them with the current. In conditions where the wind is opposite of the current & stronger than the current, your presentation will look unnatural to your targeted Fluke. White bucktails in the 3/8 to 1/2 ounce work very well. Use a short 12 inch leader of 20 to 30 pound fluorocarbon. One hook works better than 2 and only jig the rod up and down 1 to 2 inches. Braided line works very well with a light bucktail & will help keep the bucktail on the bottom and allow you to feel your lure at all times. You can tip your bucktail with a 4 inch strip of meat such as herring squid, or a Gulp New Penny Shrimp. Many other tips were offered. Those of you who missed the meeting missed a lot of very good info.
