I especially enjoyed the "History Lesson" about the VHFC and Ed entertaining us with his open-forum discussion. Ed's membership number is #1, and he is the founding father of the VHFC. I know I speak for the entire board when I say Thank you to Ed for his vision and I hope we carry on today what was intended years ago at the VHFC.

Bill Dabney has lined up another great night of guest speakers for our June meeting. Bill Donovan and

Darren Dorris, from The New Jersey Angler magazine, will be speaking on fluke fishing in the bay and ocean. You are not going to want to miss this one! For anyone that hasn't had the pleasure of hearing these two fishermen speak, you are in for a treat. Not only are they extremely knowledgeable but they are also very entertaining in their presentation. I know I certainly am looking forward to them.

I've noticed quite a few weigh-ins posted on the club web site. This is good. It means people are catching fish! I know the surf has livened up in the past month with stripers and some bluefish, and of course the dreaded skate and dogfish arrivals and they are hitting both day and night. I have also read some good reports from our members on the "Chum Bucket" web site forum. There are also stripers on the bunker pods out front and some guys are getting them on the troll on Stretch 25's or bunker spoons. There are some really big fish being reported so check your gear and make sure your knots are tight as the "fish of a lifetime" is truly a possibility!

Fluke season will be well under way as you read this. Mother Nature has been giving us quite a bit of rainy weather lately and I think this could be discouraging some fishermen from participating but those getting out are catching some fish. The JCAA Fluke Tournament is scheduled for June 13th and I know some of our members will be competing. I wish all of them good luck and be safe.

I recently spent the day with my northern fishing buddy, Cousin Russ, at Island Beach State Park. He has a beach buggy permit so we loaded up the truck and hit the sand around 7:30am. It was my first time in IBSP this year and I was surprised at how much "skinny water" they have up there, even with the tide coming in. We hit a couple of spots with no luck. Then we went to the inlet and saw a guy catch a nice 28in 7lb Weakfish on a white bucktail from the rocks

at the beach area. We tried some top water and some bucktails in the inlet. Again with no luck. We headed back up the beach to set up with bait for the high tide. Finally some action. A short Bass. Probably around 22 inches. The unknown fisherman to the north of us by about 70 yards caught 2 shorts and we had high hopes. Turned out to be our only fish of the day. Packed up about 2pm and headed home. We didn't have a great day of "catching" but we don't get to fish together as much as we would like to anymore and the chance to spend the day with someone whose company you truly enjoy, and really enjoy fishing with, made it a good day. Remember it's not always about how many fish you catch or filling the cooler with fillets, take the time to enjoy your time fishing and spending it with good friends. For to me, that is what "good fishing days" are made of.

The same seven species will continue for our 2009 Trophy Fish of the Year Program.

Blackfish

The rules are simple: you have to catch a fish of the above species, take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. If you have weighed in the largest fish of a particular species for the calendar year 2009, then you win the FOY trophy for that species. Note: your dues have to be paid before you catch an eligible fish.

SURF FISHING REPORT by Joe Filice

5/9/09

I hit the surf in Beach Haven at 6:15 a.m. High tide was approx. 8:30. Light wind out of the southeast made for a very comfortable morning on the beach. I baited one rod with a bunker chunk and one with clam. At 6:30 the bunker rod hit & I landed a 31 1/2 " Striper. Approx. 15 minutes later the bunker rod hit again and I was rewarded with a 34" striper which weighed in at 14lbs 12oz and an 18" girth. I ended the morning with a 25" throwback on clam. The fish are finally here and can only get bigger as the season moves on.

As a side note, a middle aged man and his wife stopped to talk to me and about a half hour later the woman came back down with her rod and a bunker. First issue was she asked me to cut her bunker, as she forgot a knife. I cut & baited her hook and she moved to my left to fish. 5 minutes later I was diving for my rod, thinking I had a huge hit, only to find she had casted over my line. Once I untangled the mess, she shyly asked if I could cast it out for her, which I did. I then wrapped up and headed home to weigh in and clean my catch. On Sunday morning I ran into her husband on the beach and learned that about 20 minutes after I left, she hooked and landed a 32" bass. Kinda of neat being able to help her out! Ed Cherry is Recognized for 21 Years of Service to VHFC

VHFC FOUNDER HONORED AT MAY MEETING by Ray Williams

Ed Cherry was awarded an Honorary Lifetime Membership to the VHFC at the May meeting. We truly appreciate all the things he has done for our club and for fishermen in the past quarter century. Here is his story & the story of our club:

21 years ago, things were a lot different in Manahawkin. A lot of fishermen were moving into the Village Harbour & Beach Haven West sections of Manahawkin. Ed Cherry was one of those guys. He tried to get a little help in finding good places to fish & the techniques locals were using in the area. No one would share anything. The usual answer was "The fish are in the Bay" or some other wise remark. Ed decided to get together with a few of his neighbors to help each other out. The result was the Village Harbour Fishing Club.

The first meeting was held in Ed's garage in 1987. 13 people showed up. The club was formed & Ed became member #1. His neighbor, Paul Turi was instrumental in getting the club started. Paul got the club "Non Profit" status. Initially, the yearly membership was \$5. Another guy who really helped the club grow was Charlie Kochka. Charlie was a member of the Elks Club & it seems he talked almost every Elks member into joining the VHFC! Before long, membership was up to 246 members. The club would have an August fishing tournament with up to 150 fishermen participating.

Over the years, though, the club went through a crisis. There were only a few "real" fishermen & most members didn't want to help run the club. It

was impossible to get people to serve on the board. The Board decided to disband the club. One member, Dick Vesper, agreed to reorganize the club. Dick got volunteers to help run the board. Gradually, our club has gotten its own identity. Today, just as when Ed founded the club, we are involved in teaching members how to fish the area waters, socialize with fellow members & their wives, & be involved in fishing regulations & conservation.

During all those years, Ed, by choice, never was the President; instead, he worked behind the scenes, helping us to grow, working on the original website, & became very involved with fishing regulations. We all owe Ed a big thank you for his years of efforts on behalf of us fishermen.

BILL HALUSKA SPEAKS ON STRIPERS IN THE BAY by Ray Williams

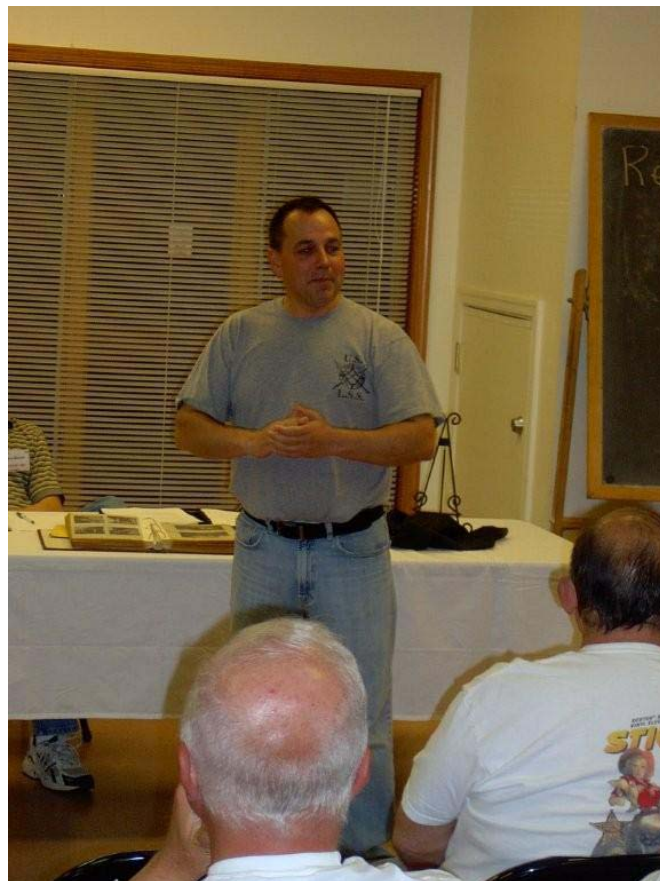

CLAMMING FOR STRIPERS 5/18/09 by Bill Jann

"We left the dock just as the sun came over the horizon.....etc, etc".....How many times have you read something like this, or have done it yourself, but today was different. They say that "time and tide wait for no man" but, in this case, we men waited for the tide. We didn't leave the dock until shortly after

noon. John Kleban, Bill Dabney and I went out from Waretown with Capt. Bill H., to catch the incoming water inside Barnegat Inlet, and soak some clams for Bass. We set up in about 10 feet of water with a basic rig.....20# test line, just enough lead to hold bottom, and a 3 foot fluorocarbon leader with a 7/0 Gamakatsu circle hook. The circle hooks did their job nicely.....all of the fish we caught were hooked in the corner of their mouths and, except for the keepers, released unharmed. A few minutes after we set up the first rod went down.....hard...I grabbed it and felt line peeling off on the drag.....not a small fish! I'm sure you know the feeling.....with three guys as witness you just pray you don't do something stupid and lose the fish. And so it went.....lift and reel, lift and reel, and then watch all the line you'd gained peel off in one run after another. The fish made good use of the tide, turning broadside to us on side-to-side runs but, eventually, Capt. Bill slid the net under her and she was ours. She turned out to be 17lbs, 12 oz, and 36" long. Just a few minutes later another rod went down....hard again...another big fish. John grabbed the rod and hung on but, after a couple of hard runs, the line went slack. It was a big Bass, John had seen it swirl, but when he reeled in, the hook was gone.....no signs of Bluefish bite on the leader, so we knew it was a Bass! A few minutes later.....DéjàVu...another rod went down and John had another hook bitten off. We didn't get a look at this one, so we're not sure what it was, but it acted like a Bass and, again, there were no signs of Bluefish bite on the leader. We got one more Bass bite.....Bill Dabney landed one at about 24".....we also got a skate, and then the bite shut off completely. No mystery to it, as the tide had come in the water temperature dropped abruptly.....by 5 degrees in a short time. So Capt. Bill lifted anchor and we moved further into the bay, in Double Creek, to get ahead of the tide. It worked! As soon as we set up in the warmer water, one of the rods went down. This time John had success and landed a nice keeper and we soon learned why. The fish only had one eye so we think John was able to keep the blind side towards him and avoid scaring this one away! Anyway, it's a theory. While we still were on the warm side of the tide, another rod went down and Bill Dabney was able to land another nice keeper. The colder water hit us again and that was the end of the bite. We then moved to the west side of the bay, near the Forked River, and worked some jig/plastic combos, hoping for weakies, but didn't get any bites. Finally, Bill moved us up river towards the power plant and we drifted down to the bay with the jig/plastics. Except for a blowfish (would you

believe!), we didn't get any more bites, so we packed it in for the day and headed home.
