

BOATING BILL by Dave Sikorski

The state senate recently passed the Shallow Water Bill 39 to zero. This bill bans the use of power vessels in water less that 12" in excess on no wake speed. In response to concerns voiced by fishermen, the bill was amended to allow the operation of a boat under "muscular power". When we get the full text of the bill, we will post it on the web site.

Another boating bill is under consideration. This one would require most boaters to pass a certified safe boating course. We will provide more details when this one passes.

2002 REEF TOURNAMENT REPORT by Dave Sikorski

Mother nature was not as kind to us for this year's Reef Tournament as last year. However, we did have 24 people signed up, in 13 boats.

On Saturday, the winds were about 6 to 10 knots early with choppy 2 foot seas. Around 11 am, the wind picked up to about 10 to 15 knots and the seas got a little rougher. Despite the weather, some of our members were able to get out to the Barnegat Light Reef, and caught some nice Fluke. Unfortunately, no Sea Bass were weighed in. The results are given below:

2002 SURF TOURNAMENT by Steve Cook

We had a nice turnout for the event, but unfortunately the fish were no shows. The weather was great except when the wind picked up late Sunday morning. We had 17 members who showed up out of 24 signed up. There were 6 that fished both days. Also, 13 members attended the luncheon afterwards.

If the fishing had been better, we probably would have had more fishermen on the second day. Perhaps, next year a later date would be better since the water temperature was still too high (high 50's). One positive sign was that we had quite a few novice surf fishermen this year.

They all seemed to enjoy themselves and mentioned that they intend to do more surf fishing in future. There was only one keeper striper caught and no bluefish. I can honestly say that I wish I didn't catch that one striper as I would have loved to see many fish weighed in. The weight for the fish was 5 lb. 4 oz. and the length of 25 in.

I hope everyone that attended did enjoy themselves and ask if anyone has any ideas or suggestions about how to improve future tournaments, please feel free to contact me or any board member.

DAVE'S FIRST KEEPER by Dave Sikorski Hi Y'all. Just thought you might want to see my first keeper Striper, finally. It was 34" long and weighed 12 lb, 12 oz. (biggest fish I've ever caught). Caught it from shore on a yellow swimming plug, in the bay inside Barnegat Inlet, just after sunset on Nov. 9th, 2002. Hopefully, I will be able to catch more.



MY 2002 WEAKFISH TOURNAMENT Story by Ray Williams

Last year's Weakfish Tournament was a lot of fun. I took an old friend, Jerry Gertner, & his son, Mitch in my boat. I knew that a lot of guys would be fishing with shrimp but I decided that we would use Fin S's & shedder crabs. We went to the Brick Pile in Marshelder Channel & drifted. We caught several small Weakfish during the morning; around noon I decided we would make one last drift before going in. As we drifted towards the very shallow water east of the Brick Pile, Mitch hooked into a big fish. We were in 3 feet of water & I knew the boat would be grounded very soon. About 5 seconds after Mitch hooked his fish, I got a hit on my line. To make a long story short, he hauled in a 6lb. 11 oz. Weakie & mine was 6lb. 7 oz. Mitch's fish won 3rd place in the tournament & I came in 5th. I guess you don't always catch the big fish at dawn & on grass shrimp!



FISHING IN FLORIDA WITH MAURICE

(Ed. Note: For the new club members – Maurice Piergrossi, an active VHFC member, former VHFC Officer and avid Weakfisher, moved to Florida last year.)

Over Labor Day Weekend our Past President Walt Thomas and his wife traveled down to visit our Past Treasurer Maurice Piergrossi and his wife at their new home in North Miami Beach. We arrived and the weather was hot, 90 degrees with sunny skies.

On Saturday Maurice, his son Nick and I traveled out into the ocean to fish. The seas were a little choppy but not bad. We left early in the morning to catch some live pilchers as bait. This attempt created some frustration with few pilchers boated. We had also stopped and got some ballyhoo for trolling. We decided to first try some wreck fishing. We drifted over a wreck in about 250 feet of water. Once getting our baits down to the bottom we quickly had action with Lane Snappers. These fish were rather small. These fish also love to steal bait. After cranking up the rigs to check baits several times in this depth, we decided to try something else.

We next went on the hunt to find Dolphin (Mahi-Mahi). We cruised from about 2 miles off shore to about 6 miles off shore not seeing any fish. As we headed back toward the inlet Nick spotted a 3'X4' piece of plywood.

We steered the boat over to check it out and we saw TONS of bait fish. Since Dolphin love shade under the plywood and since there were many bait fish around we quickly put our baits overboard in the hopes of getting some Mahi-Mahi. About three minutes later, we all got hit HARD. The Dolphin were screaming off line and they were jumping and breaking water as we fought them in. We quickly had fish in the cooler.

. We followed that piece of plywood for about two and a half hours and every time we came close to it we had Dolphin hooked. We must have boated about 40 Dolphin. They were in the 5 pound size. We keep about 10 of them.

After the two hours of fishing with none stop action we looked up and we had followed that plywood up to Fort Lauderdale. We had about a forty five minute ride back to our inlet. Everyone had a great time on the boat that day fishing. Maurice put us over the meat.

When we got back to the dock Nick cleaned the fish. While cleaning the fish for the filets the rest of the fish was thrown into the lagoon. At the bottom of the lagoon were two BIG Tarpon swimming around. They cleaned up the carcasses. One of these Tarpon had to be 150 pounds. Seeing them swim by so close to the dock was amazing. They even broke the surface of the water a few time. They knew where to get a free meal.

Once the Mahi-Mahi was filleted Maurice was nice enough to pack some into a small cooler for us to travel on the plane back to Atlantic City. When we returned home we grilled them with some teriyaki sauce and they were DELICIOUS.

Beth and I enjoyed seeing the area where Maurice and Laura are now living. We ate at some great restaurants and had some great memories. That fishing day was great. We enjoyed it so much that we have booked ourselves down there again during Christmas break. Hope the fishing is just as good.

STRIPED FLOUNDER by Dave Sikorski

I hadn't had much success fishing the beach for stripers (I've even forgotten what they look like), so one day late last year I decided to try to catch some of those winter flounder you had reported about on the beach. I stopped in at Fisherman's Headquarters for some worms and tiny little

hooks. I also picked up some clam to try for stripers as well.

I hiked all the way out to the beach, baited my striper rod with clams on circle hooks, cast out and set it in the rod holder. Then I baited up my small rod with some small pieces of worms on those tiny little hooks and cast that out. I held onto the rod for a while, then put it down.

I had found a ball of rope and fishing line that had a plug and teaser tangled up. I worked on that until I freed the plug. (happy plug) I then reeled in both rods, rebaited and cast back out, moving a few feet down the beach in the process.

I held onto the flounder rig again, and after a few minutes, I felt a little tapping. I thought to myself, cool! Jay Mann was right, there are flounder up here. So I set the hook, and he took off! Then I thought to myself, what a fish, this is a big flounder! After a few runs and about a five minute fight, I landed the biggest, strangest looking flounder I ever saw!

It was about 27 inches long, had one eye on each side of it's body, and it was white on both sides with dark stripes. This flounder looked just like a Striped Bass! Its a good thing I knew I was fishing for flounder, cause no stripers were hitting the clam rig.

I rebaited the flounder rig and about 15 minutes later I caught another one, just like the first one, but a little smaller, about 23". Hey, this flounder fishing is pretty cool, huh? You just never know...

BOATING SAFETY by Dick Vesper

I took 2 evenings of training at Southern Regional High School during the winter, received a certificate and expect a nice reduction in my boat insurance. In spite of spending most of my life near salt water and boating, I learned a lot of things that will make me a safer boater. For example, I can now tell me grandkids with authority that "Persons 12 years old or younger may not remain onboard any underway vessel (except some ferries & large commercials) unless they are properly wearing a USCG approved personal floatation device".
