I always seem to miss some of the best fishing by getting my boat in the water too late. We will have our first meeting on Friday April 14, 2006 at 7:45. I hope this will be a great fishing year for all our VHFC members. We have a lot of hands on fishing techniques planned to improve everyone's chance of catching fish. I promise I will present to you, as much fishing information, that I can gather. For those of you, who are new to the area, feel free to approach any of the board members, and ask them any questions about our club. We will have charts always available on the front tables to show you where the fish are being caught. Feel free to call me at my home phone 609-597-8572 for any questions you have about the Village Harbour Fishing Club.

Our calendar is loaded with tournaments, meetings, and our Annual Dinner/Social. We will also try having our first flea market in the near future. So bring any equipment you would like to sell, and we will set up extra tables during our hands on event.

Those of you, who like to Surf fish, we are having a tournament near Joe Pops in Ship Bottom on

Saturday May 6, 2006. Remember to fill out your Surf Tournament forms included in the newsletter. We will have extra forms available at the April meeting. You will get some excellent advice on surf fishing from the club members on the beach.

Our first speakers of the year will be discussing boat insurance and Boat US. With the prices of Boat insurance going up each year, you can save by purchasing the insurance as a group. Feel free to write down ahead of time, what you are paying. Compare it to a group rate. We are trying to save you some money. You are not obligated in any way to buy insurance. Make your own decision.

Remember the large weakfish are in the bay starting around the third week in April. Gulf Point is a hot spot for spawning weakfish. White Gulf Shrimp is the bait to use with a 1/4 to 3/8 oz. Pink shad dart. If you don't have a boat the last two bridges on Great Bay Blvd in Tuckerton are excellent during high tide. Early morning and late evening are the times to be fishing. You can also drive to the end of the road and park in the Rutgers University Marine Science Parking Lot, and walk the dirt road to the bay. We can park in their lot, as long as we do not go there as a large group, and take up all their With green crabs the tog fishing is parking. excellent. This area is also a well kept secret for Striped Bass. The problem is, as the season warms up, the green flies in the area will eat you alive, and this is no joke.

HARBORMASTER REPORT by Roland Dixon

Our day markers will change this year, New Jersey Aids to Navigation is no longer able to use cedar stakes and the bamboo used in 2005 proved too brittle and was easily damaged when struck by a vessel or by debris. It is expected that we will get floats with an anchor to mark our channel from the ICW into the Main Lagoon. Please observe the "NO WAKE" Areas.

There are major changes in operating requirements resulting from accidents, injuries and deaths. The NJ Legislature has responded with a new law (Bill 2624). It will prohibit those under the age of 16 from operating vessels, including Personal Water Craft (PWC). For those under 16 but older than 13 that have a Boating Safety Certificate (BSC) they can operate a vessel powered by an electric motor or a power vessel greater than 12 feet in length and not exceeding 10 HP.

Out-of-State residents, 16 or older must present written proof of successful completion of a Boating Safety Course. No one can operate a PWC without similar proof.

All persons born after December 31, 1978 are already required to be licensed. Before June 1, 2006 all persons born after December 31, 1968 and before December 31, 1978 must have taken an approved course. Before June 1, 2007 all persons born after 12/31/58 and before 12/31/68 will require a BSC. Before June 1, 2008 all persons born after 12/31/48 and before 12/31/58 will require a BSC. By June 1, 2009 all others will be required. Addition information on this new law will be forthcoming.

Check your insurance. For Operators under the age of 18 Boat US will reduce the liability coverage to \$25,000 and the deductible is raised to 50% of the hull value. Other penalties are anticipated.

Boating Safety Courses will be available via the Coast Guard Auxiliary and other approved sources. It is expect that courses will be available on Friday nights and Saturday Mornings in Ship Bottom during the Boating Season. Check the Sandpaper for dates.

SPRING SURF FISHING by Basil Dubrosky

In the spring months of April and May, we usually spend our time getting the boat ready for launching, talking with friends, club members and neighbors about last year and prospects for this year and a whole bunch of other things that usually exclude actual fishing. If you want to get a quick start at catching nice size fish before you launch your boat, try the surf.

I usually start around the middle of April in the area around the Ship Bottom/Brant Beach line. I try to hit a high incoming tide and will usually continue fishing for at least an hour after the high tide. I will use one pole with cut bait and one or more poles with clams or blood worms. I find that blood worms work well for Striped Bass in calm sea conditions and clams are best for rougher conditions. Bunker or Mackerel work best as cut bait. Freshen your bait often and check your tippet and main line after every bluefish.

I use a high/low rig for worms and clams. Gamagatsu bait keeper hooks will increase your hook rate. I use a fish finder rig for cut bait with a 40 or 50 pound test tippet and a 7/0 circle hook. I have found the circle hook to be very effective in the surf and it reduces large bluefish cut offs.

If your preference is for plugging, then hit the low tide near the jetties. Coinciding with sunrise and sunset will increase your luck with this type fishing.

If you are interested in a quick start to catching fish and getting your name on the leader board for fish of the year, try spring surf fishing and join other surf fishing club members at the May 6 club surf tournament.

LAST HURRAH by Bill Jann

On December 10th, Bill Dabney and I went down to the marina to take his boat out of the water for the season. With true fishermen's optimism, though, we hoped the weather would allow us to get one last shot at the stripers for the year. We stopped at Scott's bait shop on the way and got a report from his dad that there was some striper action off the Beach Haven towers.

When we got to the dock, about 9 AM, the weather was crisply cold, but calm and sunny. Things looked good except for some skim ice that had formed in the lagoon. Great Bay itself, though, was open. Bill's Parker, appropriately named "Ice Wine", carved right through to the bay and we headed down to the old Coast

Guard station. We started out by anchoring at a rip there where we had had some good fishing earlier in the season. Not today though as there was nothing on the fish finder and no bites to be had. By that time the sun had warmed things up and we had a radio report from a few boats off of the towers that there was a lot of bird action and breaking fish outside. So off we went. On the way out we saw enormous schools of fish on the finder just outside the inlet, probably croakers or herring, in about 20 feet of water. No sign, though, of birds or breaking fish. When we got off the towers everything was calm. No boats, birds, or fish. We did a little casting around without any results. Then the radio kicked in and reported the fish had moved further north. Off we went again until we finally caught up with them off of Brant Beach. What a scene! The fish finder lit up from top to bottom. Birds diving and screaming over several acres of water with fish breaking all around us. In the middle of the afternoon yet. We started casting with Hopkins spoons and jigs, and both worked. A striper and a blue at first and then all stripers. Just under the surface or down deep, it didn't seem to matter. We ended up with 3 slot fish and about a dozen just short of that, and lost a whole lot more. We were hooked up on almost everv cast we made into the ocean.

And then, at about 3 PM, it was as if someone turned off a switch. It was over. The bite stopped, the birds disappeared, and we were left sitting in a calm ocean. So we turned back in, heading for dry dock, smiles on our faces, and already looking forward to next year. What a way to end the season!!
