go weak fishing with him and his friend Bill. As you can see by the accompanying picture, we did well for the 3 ½ hours we were out. We anchored up at the west end of the middle grounds about 100 yards west of the next to last marker and chummed with grass shrimp. There was not one fish less than 22 inches. Mike, my son in-law, caught the biggest one at 27 inches. I was very happy for him as he cannot get the time/opportunity to go out fishing very often. FLUKE IN THE BAY by Bill Jann


I went down to the middle grounds last Monday 6/30and Tuesday 7/1 to do some fluking. On Monday, I had incoming water with a light ESE breeze pretty much all morning. I drifted for a while in the center of the middle grounds without any bites (not even a crab). About 9:00AM, I moved down along Holgate, about 500 yards south of 108 Buoy, and drifted in 13' of water. Got two nice keepers and three shorts by 10:00 AM. I was using chartreuse bucktail hooks with squid/killie on a 30" leader about 9" above the sinker. When the tide slowed, the bite died so I moved back to the middle grounds, about 500 yards west of the deep water off Mordecai Island. The fluke were in fairly shallow water, 5 to 6 feet deep. I got two 23" fluke, plus a couple more over 18", and only a couple of shorts. I had a seriously big one on a 1/4 oz chartreuse jig/killie, but, unfortunately, I couldn't raise him up off the bottom and he broke off (8 lb test line). I never saw the fish so you can assume it was probably a skate but in my heart, by the way he did the typical head shakes, I

know it was a fluke. The bite died about 12:00 noon and I ended up with seven nice keepers. Naturally, it was the only day this year I forgot the camera.

On Tuesday, I got an early start and caught the last of the outgoing water with a SE breeze. I fished the same area of the middle grounds as yesterday with the same tackle and got 3 nice keeper fluke and a 51/2 pound weakie and a few shorts. This time I got some pictures. The fluke bite was early. After 8:30 AM, all I got were a few sharks and sea robins. Curiously, every fish I had hooked on Monday was a fluke, nothing else.

BAR-B-QUED BLUEFISH & WEAKFISH RECIPE by Don Kamienski (retyped by Dick Vesper from a handout at one of Don's presentations)
This is the recipe I use. For best results, use 2-5

pound fish.


• Fillet your fish removing all bones but keep the skin on the fillet.

• Mix the following ingredients...

1/3 cup vinegar
1/3 cup melted butter
1/2 tsp ginger powder
1/3 cup of soy sauce
1 tsp of ketchup
Dash salt & pepper

- Heat the above mix to bet better blending.
- Baste the fillets with the mix using a soft brush
- Place thin onion slices on each fillet.
- Place fillets on a preheated grill (skin side down)
- Continue to baste every 2-3 minutes.
- After 3 minutes on the grill, poke several holes through the fish's skin with a long fork to allow the fish's oil to drain.
- Depending on the fillet's thickness, allow them to remain on the grill 15-20 minutes with the lid closed for the final three minutes.
- The fillets are ready when they begin to flake.
- Using 2 spatulas, remove the fillet in one piece from the grill. When eating, the dark meat will remain with the skin and can be discarded.
- Enjoy!

WHEN: Sun-up to 5 pm Saturday August 23, 2003

To be eligible for a prize the fish must be caught and weighed-in between these times.

WHERE: All Bay and Ocean waters between 39° 48' North and 39° 24' North

This event targets Sea Bass and Fluke, which will congregate around the reef sites, but entrants are free to probe any waters within the specified boundaries for these tasty fish. There will be a special bonus for the largest Trigger Fish.

The centers of the artificial reef sites within that range are approximately:

Barnegat Light Reef: ~39° 45' N; 74° 1.5' W **GSN Reef**: ~39° 37.5' N; 74° 1.5' W

GSS Reef: ~39 33.5' N: 74° 6.5' W Little Egg Reef: ~39° 28.5' N; 74° 11' W

Also located within this range are the Harvey Cedars Lump sites, the Barnegat and Little Egg Inlets, Oyster Creek Channel, the Bi buoy, Double Creek Channel, the Middle Grounds, the Holgate Channel, Marshelder Channel, Grassy Channel, and Great Bay.

Anglers can fish anywhere in the ocean or bay for this tournament. Tournament Chairman, Basil Dubrosky will be located at the Garden State South Reef and will stay in touch with participants by radio. Participants are welcome to drift over the floats that I will drop at the most productive reef locations.

TARGET SPECIES:

- Sea Bass: 12" min, 25 fish bag limit
- Fluke: 16 1/2" min, 8 fish bag limit
- Trigger Fish

- PRIZES: \rightarrow 1st, 2nd & 3rd heaviest (\$75, \$25 & \$20) of Sea Bass and Fluke
- ➤ Bonus: Heaviest Trigger Fish (\$50)

(Weigh in at Fisherman's Headquarters by 5pm), Any ties will be decided by first fish to be weighed in.
