I got five quarts of grass shrimp from Tony's Bait and Tackle last Sunday and chummed along the edge of a slough off Barnegat. We fished the last three hours of the incoming tide and caught about 60 weakfish with 11 being keepers. They were not big fish, but we had action.

**RODS WITH CORK HANDLES** by Dick Vesper

There is a way to keep your cork handles from drying out and cracking. Just like the corks in wine bottles, cork handles tend to dry up and crack or crumble. I found a great suggestion in Saltwater Fishing Magazine. You can go to a store that sells Birkenstock Sandals (ask your spouse or the yellow pages where that is) and buy their "Cork Life" Product. It comes in a two-ounce jar with a small brush attached inside the lid. You simply spread it on your rod handles (I wiped it smooth with a paper towel) and let it dry. I did and it seems fine. Time will tell.

**FISHING REPORT BY JOHN KLEBAN**

Drove down to Cape May, NJ for our annual Tuna trip with Captain George Gilbert. In our party were Hank Desch, John Kleban and Bob Chervenah (not a club member yet). We left the dock around 4:30 AM and were at the fishing grounds about 6:45AM. At this point George slowed the boat down so the bait could be prepared. In about 15 minutes the box of Butterfish was cut up with a few saved for baits. The sky was clear with 4-foot swells from the south and 1 foot waves from the west. The wind was light. About 7:00AM the boat was positioned next to a stopped Scallop boat. They were emptying their nets and cleaning the Scallops. We put our chum into the water to add to theirs. The lines went into the water and it was instant hookup. By 8:00 AM we had our limit of 3 Bluefin Tuna from 55 to about 80 Lbs. During this time 3 fish were lost also.

George asked us if we wanted to continue or start home. It was decided to suffer some more. During the next 3 hours we brought 7 more Bluefin to be released at the boat and lost about 3 or 4 more. The fish were from 55 to over 100 Lbs. It was taking anywhere from 10 minutes to over 1/2 hour to subdue the fish. The water was clear so we were able to see the Tuna zipping under the boat and picking up the bait.

At 11:00 AM we were totally exhausted and told George to PLEASE take us home since we had suffered enough.



#### **FISHING REPORT** by Roland Dixon

The "Searcher II" is a charter that takes large parties and is at Barnegat Light Boat Basin. Joan and I were back to Barnegat Light on Monday when the Searcher came in (they only do parties) and they had a 5' Mako. They recognized us from previous visits and gave Joan a 5# chunk. It's delicious. They said the Mako came up to the boat several times in the chum slick and the baited a hook with bluefish filets. After about 5 tries it took the bait and then it took about 15 minutes to get it aboard. Remember, skates and sharks should be eviscerated and bled as soon as possible. The urea in their blood (also in crabs) turns to ammonia and can make you sick. If there is even the slightest taste of ammonia when eating shark or skate wings, forget about eating it.

**TEXAS SIZED CATFISH** by Jim Brooker (Va.)



This is a picture of a catfish that a guy recently caught at Lake Texoma. According to the news, he was fishing from the shore with 20 pound test line. When he realized what a huge fish he had caught, he stayed in the water with it and kept it close to shore with his hands. He used his cell phone to call a friend and tell him to bring a scale. The friend got there and the scale topped out at 100 pounds. They took it to the nearby Bait shop and weighed it there. It weighed 121 pounds! Luckily a Game Warden was there and called the Athens Freshwater Fisheries Center and asked them if they wanted the fish. They sent a 'live truck' to the sight and brought the fish safely to Athens. They are getting it ready for the public to view. The paper said that it would be two to three weeks before they'd release into the public tank. They estimated that the (still living) 121 pound catfish was about 27 years old!

**SEAFOOD LOUISIANA** from Flo Williams

½ cup chopped onion	1 clove minced garlic
¼ green pepper, chopped	¼ cup butter (or oil)
2 tbsp. Flour	1 can of diced tomatoes
A dash cayenne pepper	½ tsp. chili powder
1 ½ tsp. Salt	½ tsp. Sugar
1 pint scallops	1 pint oysters (drained)
2 tbsp. grated parmesan cheese	
3 cups cooked rice (1 cup uncooked)	

Sauté onion, garlic, and green pepper in butter (or oil) until brown. Stir in flour. Add remaining ingredients (except rice) and blend well. Spread cooked rice in a casserole and pour seafood mixture on top. Bake in 350 degree oven for 45 minutes and serves four.

**BARNEGAT BAY CLAM CHOWDER** by Anon.

3 dozen top neck clams (more if desired)  
 3 strips of bacon - cut up  
 3 lbs. of potatoes, peeled and diced

**Eazy Way: Use chopped clams, frozen diced potatoes, and bottled**

1 gallon milk, 1 pint heavy cream, 1 stick butter, black pepper, celery salt, parsley, basil, 1 onion – cut up small, corn starch - to thicken, if desired

- Steam clams open & chop up; save the broth.
- Parboil diced potatoes in large pot.
- Brown the bacon, then add the onion and 2 cups of clam broth. Cook until onion is tender.
- Add potatoes & clams & cover with milk.
- Add heavy cream and a cut up stick of butter.
- Bring almost to boil, stirring. DO NOT LET MIXTURE BOIL!
- Season to taste
- Thicken, if desired, with a mix of cornstarch and milk. Add this mix and keep stirring.

Let simmer for a while and enjoy!
