

STRIPED BASS REGS DISCUSSED AT JCAA MEETING by John M. Borick

A representing council of the New Jersey Fish and Game was present at the May JCAA meeting. Some of the important facts that were brought to our attention were, that 26% of the NJ Striped Bass population could be removed in any given year (without impeding the continuing repopulation of the species for coming years). Last year 17,000 N.J. fishermen sent in for Striped Bass bonus tags. An additional 25% more tags, were sent to Charter and Party Boats. Only 10% of these tags are returned to make up a survey of how many Striped Bass are caught under the bonus program.

They also talked about the five Striped Bass options, that the N.J. Fish and Game brought to the ASMFC commissioners to bring N.J. to compliance by July 31, 2004. The five options are listed below.

<u>Option 1:</u> 2 fish at greater or equal to 28 inches, no bonus program (no lb limit, catch seen as small)

<u>Option 2:</u> 2 fish at greater or equal to 28 inches, with bonus fish at greater or equal to 28 inches (321,750 lbs)

<u>Option 3:</u> 2 fish at greater or equal to 28 inches, with bonus fish at 24 to less than 28 inches (109,046 lbs)

Option 4: 1 fish at 24 inches to less than 28 inches and 1 fish at 34 plus inches with bonus fish at greater or equal to 28 inches (321,750 lbs)

<u>Option 5:</u> 1 fish at 26 to less than 30 inches and 1 fish at 33 plus inches with bonus fish at greater or equal to 30 inches (321,750lbs)

When total pounds caught reaches the limit (number in parentheses above for selected option), the NJ Striped Bass season will be closed.

The majority of the JCAA member clubs wanted option 2. New Jersey Fish and Game is pushing for option 4.

After the Fish and Game people left the meeting, Ed Cherry gave a brief talk. He stated that the NJ Fish and Game is trying to put a saltwater license in place under the guise of a permit fee for a bonus tag. Letters must be written to the Governor and NJ Senators in the near future.

VHFC members will notified fully when the specifics for our letter writing are defined.

Thomas P. Fote, the legislator representative of the JCAA, told us the following. The Division thinks the solution is to charge for the tags. They say we should be paying to run the program. What they fail to say is that we are already paying to run the program through our tax dollars and many other fees. Let's look at exactly what NJ is spending. New Jersey spends about 3.1 million dollars on the Marine Division of Fish and Wildlife. That is to manage commercial and recreational fishing and every other expense covered by this Division. New Jersey only puts 1.1 million dollars into this program. Much of the other 2 million dollars comes from Wallop Breaux money, which is funded by the excise tax on recreational fisherman. The remainder comes from federal grants (our federal tax dollars). As an example, the sales tax generated by recreational anglers in NJ is between 41 and 61 million dollars. The Division needs an additional 2 million dollars to run their program well. The long-term solution is to secure more funding from the NJ legislature. In the short term, we need about 195,000 dollars to be included in the striped bass bill that will be considered by the current legislature. We don't need a backdoor saltwater fishing license. JCAA has never approved a saltwater fishing license.

OBTAIN AND USE STRIPED BASS BONUS CARDS

Based on the immediately preceding report (STRIPED BASS REGS DISCUSSED AT JCAA MEETING) and a verbal message presented by Ed Cherry at VHFC's May Meeting, we should only be using the Trophy Fish Bonus Card when we are keeping a third fish.

VHFC SELECTS CHANNEL 72 by Dave Sikorski

The VHFC board of trustees has decided to make channel 72 our official VHF channel. The purpose is so that club members can communicate with each other on a less crowded channel. Most folks use channel 9, which is supposed to be used for hailing, not for conversation. Try hailing on channel 9 or 72 for Village Harbour club members. If you find someone, switch to channel 72 and discuss what's happening or not happening. This is a way we can work together as a club to share real time fishing information when it counts, while you are out there. Hopefully this will help us all catch more fish. We picked channel 72 because it should be easy to remember, just think of Route 72. Give us a call.

For example, for member communications, the following steps would work:

 Hail any member(s) with a VHF radio on channel
"VHFC...VHFC..' your boat' name....Come Back'"

2. Members may reply to you with the message: "Switch to the club channel". (identify yourself/boat name) If need be, you can tell responders : "Switch to the club channel". (Try to avoid telling everyone out there that the club channel is 72)

3. Switch your radio to channel 72 and call "VHFC...VHFC" and, when they answer, start chatting.

4. Please remember to be patient with all the others who are also using the limited number of VHF channels.

HOLGATE FISHING REPORT by Harry Barr

I was fishing near Holgate inlet on Saturday and we landed a 4 Foot sand shark and a 22" weakfish. We were drifting the outgoing tide off buoy 117 and were really getting a lot of action on clams

THE FLUKE ARE BACK by Dave Sikorski

As we discussed at our May meeting, our bay has been plagued by the dreaded slime weeds, making fishing nearly impossible, especially for fluke. The good news is that the slime is starting to subside. On May 22 and 23, I tried fishing the Middle Grounds at the end of the incoming tide. I was hoping that the water would be cleaner at this tide stage. I was pleasantly surprised, as the water was clean and there was very little slime weed. I tried several locations in the area, and finally started catching fluke along the edges of the main channel. My combined two day totals were 3 keepers and 5 shorts. Not huge fish or big numbers, but it was good to have a fresh fluke for dinner, for a change. These fish were caught on plain killies, and killies on a red and white bucktail. There were also reports that fluke are being caught along the Holgate Channel, Grassy Channel and in Great Bay. If you want some fluke for the table, try the basics: find the clean water and channel edges, and you should be able to catch some. See you out there.

FLUKING IN SEA ISLE CITY by Ray Williams

May 18th, Bill Dabney, John Kerstanski, & I went on a charter trip with Captain Al Crudele of Bayhound Charters in Sea Isle City. The purpose of the trip was to target weakfish & fluke in the back bays behind Sea Isle City.

On Monday afternoon, May 17th, Bill had called me to ask me to meet him & John at 4:30am at his house in Manahawkin. Monday night the fog closed in around my house. When I went to bed, I was convinced that getting up at 3:30am was going to be a total waste of time because we would spend a few hours at the dock waiting for the fog to lift.

When I got up Tuesday morning at 3:30 am I was totally surprised to look out my window & see the streetlight down the lagoon shining brightly! The fog had completely disappeared. Well, I thought, this might be a good day after all. We met at Bill's house & ran into the first snag of the day. A tanker loaded with 8000 gallons of kerosene had turned over the night before on Route 72 & we had to take Route 9 down to Tuckerton to avoid the mess. We arrived at our destination at 5:30 am & the Captain was waiting for us.

Captain Al told us he had caught a 9lb. weakfish the night before but it had taken several hours of jigging to find this one fish. We decided to start the day targeting weakfish & if unsuccessful to try our luck at fluking. The day dawned clear with a little breeze which gave us relief from the gnats that had plagued the area for the last few days. We tried plastic worms in several places but had only a couple of lures bitten off by blues to show for our efforts.

Al Crudele uses a 21 foot Everglades Flats boat for his charters. This boat draws very little water & is excellent for fishing in skinny waters. He took us back into the channels looking for fluke. We fished in a sluice that was about 5 to 6 feet deep. Al worked the boat along the edge of the channel using the 115 horse 4 stroke Yamaha motor to keep us right on the edge of the channel. That motor is very quiet & can run at low rpms all day without fouling the plugs! We caught the last part of the outgoing tide & the first part of incoming tide using rigs that Al had made up. The rigs consist of a 5/8ths ounce green & white buck tail tied to one end of a 20 pound leader. About 12 inches up, he attaches a 1/0 chartreuse octopus hook with a surgeons loop. The leader is tied on to your line with a swivel. Al uses light spinning gear with 8 to 10 pound test line. A killie is used on the hook & a strip of fresh mackerel on the buck tail.

We fished throughout the morning & early afternoon. At the end of the day we had 12 keeper fluke up to 3 ½ pounds & one Sun Dial. We also had about 12 throwbacks. A ratio of one to one isn't bad! I highly recommend Captain Al Crudele to anyone wanting to fish that area & I am grateful to Bill Dabney for setting up the trip. Bill, John, & Dave Sikorski had gone on a trip with him on April 30th & had a great time as well as catching some nice fish.

A LITTLE FISH REPORT by John Nonnenmacher

It was a quiet Tuesday, the tide was ready to fall so I stuck my old surf rod into the truck and headed for the bait shop.

I've been through this before--nothing much going on so I think I'll go watch the waves on the beach. The clams were going through their last days so I stuck one on the hook and put a rubber band over it; to hold it from washing off. It was a beautiful day and I noticed that I was the only one on the entire beach with a fishing rod. Out into the blue water went the clam and I sat down to enjoy the next few hours. Not a nibble for over an hour. Now I began to realize why no one else was fishing on the beach. As I picked up my rod to pack it in, I felt a strong tug--something told me I had a nice fish on the hook. After peeling some line from the reel, I turned it into shore and with the help of a

wave. managed to bring it onto the beach. I was looking at the nicest striper that I've taken--(I've taken very few). Just for the record I took it for a weigh-in and measurement. Now I knew it was no record size but I had to show someone to prove what I caught.

My neighbors were not home and I finally had to clean it so I had my wife snapped this photo. It was 33" long.



BLUEFISH & BLUE CLAW REPORT by Bill Jann

5/14/04: After a morning of catching this year's plentiful crop of bluefish, down at the middle grounds, I stopped on my way back in, just to see if any crabs had survived the winter. I wasn't expecting much, since last spring I didn't get any until early July. I stopped at the channel edge, just North of the causeway, and put out a few lines baited with mchicken. I wasn't expecting anything much and was quite surprised to get 13 crabs in a little over an hour. They all had the obvious rusty color from wintering in the bay marshes; most of them were just over the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " mark. Chicken was the best bait. Later, after I cooked them, I found they all had super hard shells, so they hadn't shed since last fall.

5/22/04: It continues! A lot of fog today so I stayed close in, again just North of the causeway, and set out some crab lines. There was a nice current, running to the South. Not as much weed and 67 degrees. The bait was chicken and bluefish, and both worked well today. Despite all the snotweed, we started getting crabs right away. At first they were all right about 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", but later we got some bigger ones, up to 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Today's crabs were almost all freshly shed. Their shells were like paper and squeaky clean. Not as much meat in them as the harder shelled ones, but they sure are easier to pick. Later,

we moved to the Mill Creek channel, in front of Beach Haven West, and did just as well. The bite died when the tide slacked and we ended up with about 40 legal crabs. Kept the biggest 24.

5/25/04: It gets better! Tried for a repeat of the last trip for crabs and did even better. Started out again at the channel edge just North of the causeway. The weed was just about all gone, water nice and clean at 74 degrees, and moving south. Baited with chicken and bluefish and started picking up good sized crabs right away. Didn't keep anything under 5". Lots of 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and even a couple of 6"ers. Today they were all freshly shed. We had a steady bite from 8:30 to 11:30, and a gorgeous day to go with it. Again, the Mill Creek channel edge was equally good. We ended up catching well over 50 and kept the best 36.

5/29/04: As an addendum, I went out again on Saturday and got more than 80, in about 3 hours, and kept the biggest 50, just north of the causeway again. In all the years I've been on LBI, I've never seen early season crabbing this good. They're big, they're plentiful, and dumb enough to bite on almost anything.

I haven't done any fancy culinary tricks yet. Just steamed them all with Old Bay and pepper, then sat around the table with some melted butter, garlic, and hot sauce, set over lots of newspaper, and some cold brews. Guys, it don't get much better than this!

FLORIDA FISHING by Don Longstreet

These pictures show the sharks that my grandson Kenny and I caught on Tyndall AFB beach. I was here in mid-May 2004 for my youngest son's retirement ceremony from the U.S. Air Force.

My shark was about 40lbs and Kenny's was about thirty pounds. We caught a total of 5 sharks during this trip. It is a wonder that people swim on this beach. The other picture is one of the small sharks teeth. We didn't want to get near the teeth of the larger sharks. I had ten pound test line on my pole and it took about 25 minutes to bring in and the

picture proves it.


