Well that one was taken, so we moved to marker 17 (Gerry was upset that he could not get to marker 19 so I told him the next time make reservations, he said something about me knowing how to swim), we anchored up and started fishing. Well it looked like it was going to be a bad day, Gerry was chumming with everything we had except the kitchen sink (and you know Gerry, he is a retired plumber so I was waiting for him to throw in the kitchen sink too). Finally his efforts paid off and we started catching fish. It's nice fishing with Gerry, he puts a lot of effort into fishing and tries very hard, and I honestly believe that it was his efforts that day that helped us catch fish.

VHFC FLEA MARKET by John Borick

The Village Harbour Fishing Club will run a Flea Market in June at the General Meeting on June 9th. From all the records, I can gather the last time, we had a Flea Market was back in 1992, and we even had our own auctioneer. We like to try this event on a much smaller scale. This will be a free event, and there will be no cost charged by the club. While we are setting-up tables for our hands-on fluke and weak fishing techniques, we will set-up additional tables for those individuals who have something to sell. This will be an added benefit for belonging to our club. You will have to monitor your own table, and any equipment you intend to sell. If you do not have that many items to sell, the club can put as many as three members to a table. Anyone interested, talk to one of our Board Members at the May VHFC meeting. Remember the saying "One man's junk is someone else's treasure." Just remember no checks or credit cards; if you're interested in buying anything bring some extra cash to our June meeting. If you have something to sell that is fishing related, bring it to the meeting.

FLOAT FISHING THE SALMON RIVER by Basil Dubrosky

The alarm went off at 3:25 AM. Trapper, our guide, wanted us at the river at 4:30 AM because he expected lots of competitive pressure on the river since the river flow had been dropped to one favoring good fishing just the previous day. The Salmon River in Pulaski, NY is fed by lake water with the flow being adjusted according to lake level and electric power company needs. The river flows into Lake Ontario.

Nick and I dressed and went to the public room of the Double Eagle Lodge where we were staying for the next 3 days. After coffee and some great blueberry muffins we headed back to our room to don warm clothes and our waders and wading jackets. It was going to be a relatively warm day for March, 32 degrees now with a high of 40. The water temperature was said to be 33 degrees. There had been light snow over night.

We met Trapper at 4:20 AM at the beginning boat ramp where Trapper had already dropped his boat. Nick and Trapper went off to park Trapper's truck and trailer at our expected exit boat ramp about an 8 mile drift away. There are many boat ramps on the Salmon and the beginning and ending ramp is chosen by the guide according to where he expects the fish to be.

I waited in the dark with the boat and our equipment. There were no other fishermen in the area and I could barely make out the water in the dark but the sound of the rush of the water was exhilarating. Nick and Trapper returned in Nick's truck after about 15 minutes and we all boarded the drift boat and departed in the dark.

The drift boats are made of heavy gauge aluminum with 2 customer seats side by side in the front and a rowing seat in the middle for the guide. There is a fish box under the guide's seat and a propane heater in the back to warm hands when they are too cold to function (especially during Dec-Feb when the biggest Steelhead and the craziest of fishermen are in the water).

Trapper rowed us out into the current and we headed downstream trusting our safety to a man with almost 20 years experience fishing daily on the river during the high season. We kept busy talking about our float plan and where the fish were caught the previous day. We eased into our first spot (The Wire Hole) while it was still dark. We were going to have to wait for about an hour before we could start fishing.

We spent the time drinking coffee and reminiscing about previous trips and experiences. Trapper also spent some time trying to sell us on a trip to his remote wilderness Alaska fishing camp where the catching of many species of trout and salmon are non-stop. Nick had made the trip to Alaska 2 years ago and could attest to the non-stop action.

As it gradually got lighter we could enjoy the beauty of the freshly fallen snow on the trees. The river had beautiful ice-laden edges that were 2 feet higher than the current water level. Other drift boats passed us and other fishermen showed up near our position prompting a new round of stories. We were now happy that we had gotten an early start.

As soon as it was light enough to fish we got out of the boat and started drifting egg sacks with our 91/2 foot, 7 weight noodle spinning rods. These long and light rods are designed to fight big fish using light line. The fish are tired out by the action of the rod, not the power of the line and reel. You often have to put the butt of the rod toward the fish in order to tire him with the strength of the rod.

After many drifts through the creases in the water mapped out by Trapper and the frequent changing of fouled rigs and egg sack colors both Nick and I connected with and released Steelhead. The first fight of the day is particularly exciting but we were both able to fight our fish to Trapper's waiting net before releasing them.

We continued drifting the river, stopping at several pre-selected spots to try our luck. The boat banged the bottom often and we had to shift our weight forward to get over extremely shallow ledges. I marveled at the skill possessed by Trapper as he navigated the fast moving waters with many rock and tree obstacles and narrow passages.

Most landlocked fishermen let us pass through their fishing spots with understanding. Trapper helped to calm any irritation they may have held with wellrehearsed banter. Fishing exaggerations passed back and forth.

We dropped our mono size as the day progressed from 8 to 6 to 4 pound test for these line shy fish. We also started using brightly colored flies. Several other Steelhead between 5 and 8 pounds were caught and released and one that weighed over 10 pounds made a great show of strong runs and crashing jumps.

We stopped at about 8 spots during the day and finished our trip around 4 PM. We were cold and exhausted but pleased with the experience. We had seen and fished remote and picturesque parts of the river, enjoyed the banter amongst fishermen and learned fishing techniques from Trapper that will last a lifetime. We arranged to do it again in April!
