SEASON ENDING FISHING REPORT FROM THE FLORIDA KEYS by Bill Logan

The title says "Season Ending Fishing Report". Well, for some of us it is down here, but for others it continues on and on and on. This season has been one of the most productive and fun times for me, and I can't wait for October to get back down here. We have been coming to the Florida Keys for seven years; of those seven years four have been here at our R.V. Resort that also houses our Marina where I keep my Grady White. We have made many new friends who come from all over the United States, and yes Canada. Some have been coming to the Keys for over fifteen plus years and have great knowledge of fishing in the Keys, and have shared their knowledge with me, either by fishing on my boat or theirs. This year I befriended one of the residents (Ray Walls from Joliet IL), who is a good fisherman and loves to flat line for Yellow Tail Snappers. He has a 2005 - Sea Hunt 21 foot Center Console (with no T-Top) (AAH) powered by a 150 HP Johnson. This man can catch fish; we leave the dock at 8am, go out in the Atlantic, setup in about 70 feet or more, and within one and half or two hours we have our limit of Yellow Tail Snappers (10 Per Angler). Keeper size is 12 inches but we will only keep anything 14 to 15 inches and up, are back at the dock by 10:30 am, with boat & fish cleaned by 11: am. Of course I have to clean the boat and Ray cleans the fish, he doesn't like the way I do it, clean the fish that is. For those club members who do not know what flat lining is, we anchor, put the chum bag over to get the slick going. We use a lot of chum and I do mean a lot, sometimes

we will go thru 4 to 6 boxes of chum; remember the water is a lot warmer down here than in New Jersey so that chum goes quickly, you have to keep the slick going to keep the fish around the boat. We also toss out hands full of Mahoous, (that's probably not spelled right) and a mix of cracked corn and rolled oats. This gets the fish up off the bottom and around the boat. Sometimes you get the fish or sometimes a predator gets your fish; while bringing in one of my fish all I had was the head. It could have been a King Mackerel, Barracuda, False Albacore or a shark that took my fish. Rig setup is strictly a preference; I use a Penn Line Counter 209LC with 20lb test on a Light Shamano rod (no braided line or swivel) with a 20lb leader tied right to the line with a very small treble hook. Some guys use Spinning Reels with Jigs; some with small hooks. Like I said, it is all your preference, whatever works for you. I would like to make note that there is very little drift fishing done here, unlike New Jersey. Because of the sea bottom (Coral) (trust me I known I lost another anchor this year, that's two years in a row now) I have 20 foot of chain hooked to the front and rear of a Claw (reef) anchor with breakaway ties tied to the back end of the anchor. If the anchor gets hung up on the coral the tie breaks and you pull the anchor up from the front; but if the chain gets wrapped around the coral you're screwed.

March has not been to kind to us with the wind this year; we did not get out as often as we would have liked to. Our last day of fishing was this past Wednesday (that would have been the 4th of April), and it was still blowing hard, but Ray and I wanted to get one last day in, so we said the heck with the wind and went and got the you know what kicked out of us going out, but, it was worth the trip, as we had some very nice big Yellow Tail Snappers, with our limit of 20 in 1 & 3/4 hours. Plus, the ride back was only half as bad as the ride out (ouch).

Now! I can't wait to get home, with the new Fluke regulations it looks good to me, and opens up a greater opportunity to catch some keepers.

I want to wish Joe Filice, our new president, a great year. From the minutes of the board meetings I have been receiving it looks like he is off to a great start. Your Board is 110% behind this club, so come out and support them, we have some great speakers lined up and good events.

Hope to see you all at Mays meeting.

STRIPED BASS REPORT AND PHOTOS FOR FRIDAY, APRIL 13 by Vince Sibona

John Kleban and I left the dock at 6:30 on the SEA BONA and went out of Barnegat Inlet for striped bass. We headed north for about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ miles and spotted some birds. Only a few of the birds were actually working. At 7:15, I slowed the boat down to trolling speed and John put out the umbrella rigs. Within 5 minutes we boated our first keeper bass. We continued trolling with some birds around and we kept an eye on the other boats in the area, some fisherman trolling and some jigging. We really didn't see any fish being caught. A half hour went by and we hadn't got another hit. Then I spotted fish on the screen and we had another bass on and soon it was boated. I turned the boat and headed back to the same area and before John could get the line back in the water, we had another bass on. I kept circling the boat into the same area and this happened 3 times in a row. We caught fish while trolling with only one line in the water. We caught 5 fish in this area in a short time. We trolled around until around 10:00 without any more hits, so we decided to run in. We had a good day catching some nice bass and considering we didn't any other fish being caught. We caught 6 stripers 28" to 2 at 34". John has a bonus tag, so we were able to keep 5 bass. My fish weighed in at 15.8 lbs. and John's fish weighed in at 15.55 lbs. We had a beautiful sunny day with light winds and 2' wave heights. Ocean water temperature was 47 degrees. Air temperature was in the low 60's.

FISHING REPORT by John Kleban

Yesterday Friday the 13th (strike 1) I went fishing with Vince Sibona. Vince brought along a banana (strike two). With only two strikes nothing significantly happened negatively and we had a great day of catching fish. Today I went out to fish with Paul Galasso. Paul took off the cover of the rearview mirror and glass was broken (strike 3). It didn't take long to realize the fishing Gods will make it an interesting day. The flow meter gauge for the starboard engine was not functioning. We proceeded to Barnegat Inlet and after exiting the inlet we noticed two fleets. One fleet was about 2 miles out and ³/₄ of a mile north of the inlet. The other fleet was about 2 miles north of this fleet and approximately $2 \frac{1}{2}$ miles out. We started trolling when we were about a quarter mile short of the first fleet. The trolling speed was a little fast but we try to deploy a bunker spoon and two deep divers. The Bunker spoon was not functioning properly but we were hoping that maybe some crazy Bass wood grab it anyway. After skirting the northern portion of the first fleet we started heading north towards the second fleet and the speed of the boat increased a little bit more making us realize the spoon was not going to work properly for us so we took it in. During this time Paul was able to correct the problem with the gauge and it started to function properly. After about half an hour the starboard rod sang the musical song of fish on. We reeled in the fish and it turned out to be a 34 inch fish that when approximately 15 pounds. We continued traveling north to the second fleet but they were dispersing and start to move south so we turned around and started to head south. After traveling another 45 min. to an hour the reel on the port side started to sing the magical song. After reeling in the fish we started the boat moving and within 5 min. the starboard rod set started singing the magical song. We started to move a little further south and while Paul was deploying the starboard rod and was ready to put the line into it clipped a fish grabbed the line and almost pulled it out of Paul's hand, but we missed that fish. We saw a fleet developing about a mile south of the channel going into Barnegat Inlet and started heading that way. After about a half an hour we did make any headway to fleet that just seem to be moving. After about 45 min. to an hour we still seem to be making no headway on the fleet that was moving further and further south. At this point we decided that we're going to pick up lines run down south a little faster. When we were close to the fleet we started trolling again and within 5 minutes the. Fish on was heard. We started trolling after we boated the fish and within about 10 min. fish on was heard again. The fleet still moving further and further south and they were about in the vicinity of what look like some kind of structure that I think they using for replenishing the sand on Long Beach Island. Paul decided to try a lure that he had just purchased over the winter that was blue, green, yellow, red and white. I started to let the line out and when I was out about of 75 feet or so it felt like the lure got snagged on a line. The lure popped out of the water and looking at it seems strange until it was noticed that lo and behold a striped bass was hooked. We reeled the fish in and decide if enough is enough and headed home. We had our Limit and released the other fish. A great day was had and we were home for a late lunch and an early afternoon nap. The Fish Gods were very good to us today.

FISHING REPORT by John Henson

Fished the surf today, April 22, on LBI, midisland, with my cousin Tony. Fished from 4 am till 1 pm. 4 rods total--3 with bunker and one with clams. There was a fair amount of people fishing with most of them showing up after davbreak. Very slow with only 4 skates to show for our efforts--till around 10:30 when Tony's clam rod gets pulled down out of the spike. He got to the rod and thought he had a "nice" bass on. After a decent fight he got the fish on the beach to find he had a Black Drum!! This was only the 3rd time Tony had been surf fishing, and the first "non-garbage" fish he had landed. Needless to say he was very happy! We stopped at club sponsor Fisherman's Headquarters where Greg and the crew were happy to weigh it for him--- 11.6 pounds and 27 inches. Only saw one bass beached by the angler to our south and he was fishing clams. Slow fishing but still a good dav.

U.S. COAST GUARD TO BEGIN USE OF NEW BOATER WARNING DEVICE by Bill Logan

The LA-51 is a boater warning device being used in support of the Coast Guard's coastal security mission when other methods fail to get the attention of boaters in violation of laws or regulations. The device is a projectile fired from a 12-gauge shotgun at a range of more than 300 feet. It ignites in mid-air in front of the target vessel and produces a loud noise and bright flash similar to a firework. Other methods the Coast Guard currently use include lights, siren and marine-band radio.

Editor's Note: I'd like one of these to use to get the attention of those boaters that blast right over my fishing lines out in the Bay!
