October marks the beginning of surf fishing season. Lately, we have noticed many of our members showing interest in learning more about this type of fishing. In response to this increased interest, we have scheduled another hands-on learning session at our October 14th meeting; this one dedicated to surf fishing. We will be talking about what equipment to use, lures, baits, rigs, etc.

The chamber is also sponsoring the 51st annual LBI Surf Fishing Contest, which starts October 8th and ends November 20th. This tournament features some very large weekly, segment and Grand prizes, as well as daily cash prizes. The entry fee is only \$25 for this 6-week tournament.

Our VHFC surf fishing tournament will be held on October 15 and 16 this year. This is a fun multispecies event, and this year we will be fishing together so we can help each other learn what we know individually and collectively about surf fishing. Last year, 10 and 11 pound fish were landed in this event. See the sign up sheet in this newsletter for further details.

As mentioned at our meetings, we have added Bluefish to the Fish of the Month (FOM) line-up for October and November this year. This is in addition to our traditional Striped Bass FOM prize.

As the year begins to wind down, the club will start to focus on 2006. We would really like to get some new folks on the Board for next year. Several folks have made many good suggestions, which we would like to implement, but we need your help doing so. John Borick will be our club's President next year, and will certainly appreciate all the help he can get. Please volunteer to help the club and join the Board. REGULATORY REPORT by Dave Sikorski

<u>Winter Flounder:</u> The 2005 season is over: There will be no Fall 2005 season for Winter Flounder in New Jersey this year. Next year the season will only be open in the Spring.

<u>Weakfish</u>: Discussions are currently underway to decide the fate of the Weakfish regulations for next year. (Ed Note: The ASMFC's options range from "no change" to "no fishing season". See details and info on meetings we can attend and influence below)

YOU NEED TO ATTEND ONE WEAKFISH MEETING IN OCTOBER by Dick Vesper & Dave Sikorski

Our right to catch and keep weakfish in 2006 is in serious jeopardy. The weakfish stock is dropping rapidly and JCAA, RFA, Ed Cherry, Dick Vesper and others know it is not due to any fishing pressure; rather to natural causes.

We need everyone who can, to attend one of the Weakfish meetings in NJ (see below) and let the regulators know how we feel. We want a status quo; no change.

The New Jersey Department of Fish & Wildlife (DFW) and Atlantic States Marine Fishing Council (ASMFC) have scheduled public hearings for October 12 and 13.

THIS IS SERIOUS ISSUE -NOT A DRILL

ASMFC has drafted 4 options for us in 2004: 1) same limits as in 2005, 2) 4 fish limit, 3) 1 fish limit,

1) same limits as in 2005, 2) 4 fish limit, 3) 1 fish limit, or 4) closed to recreational and commercial fishing.

Even ASMFC's scientists are reported as saying that fishing pressure is not the problem.

The ASMFC and the state Division of Fish and Wildlife will hold two public hearings:

➤ 7 p.m. Oct. 13 at the Ocean County Administration building, Room 119,101 Hooper Ave. Toms River

➤ 7:30 p.m. Oct. 12 at Rutgers' Cooperative Research and Extension Svc., 355 Court House - South Dennis Rd. (Rte 657), Cape May Court House,

Please attend and, if possible, get up and say you are a Village Harbour Fishing Club Member and a recreational fisherman and you want a status quo regulation in 2006. Other members will be there.

09-13-05 by Bill Jann

The total catch was 7 keepers, 12 shorts, 1 seabass, and a bunch of skates. We went out with Ron Nachman on

the R&R. Jerry Papp, from our club, was also one of the crew, 5 guys in all. We wanted to give what might be a last try at fluke ... the weather was perfect so we went out to Barnegat reef ... light winds and a modest drift, we were able to get by with 4 oz sinkers in 55 feet of water ... it was a slow pick ... after a couple of hours we had 2 keepers, a bunch of shorts, and some skates ... Captain Ron wanted to go out to a large wreck, part of the garden state north reef, that he had numbers on ... he found it right away and we spent the rest of the day drifting near it ... depth was about 80 feet ... I got 3 keepers, including a 20 incher ... we used frozen spearing, fluke belly, and cut squid in shedder oil ... Here are three pictures:

Bill Dabney and I went out to do some crabbing yesterday (9/28/05). We caught the only day all week that the wind didn't blow. It was warm and sunny with a light breeze. We anchored up near the causeway and had a nice pick of crabs all morning. Used chicken for bait. We ended up with 68 altogether, all nice size, some over 6 inches, and about a 50/50 mix of males and females. In fact, we didn't get a single undersized crab all morning (first time ever for that). It's amazing how the bay empties out in late September; we didn't see another boat for over an hour, and not too many after that. The bite was best on the last of the incoming water, kind of died on the slack, and then picked up again on the outflow.

Dave Sikorski and I left the dock at 6:30 AM and motored out Beach Haven Inlet into a calm sea. We reef anchored on a wreck and began catching Sea Bass, Porgies, Blue Fish, Fluke, Bonita, Croakers and Trigger Fish. The Trigger Fish were quite a surprise. They were in the 4 pound range and fought hard. After we left the wreck, we motored to 60 feet depth and began catching Fluke non-stop. We must have boated 30 but only 3 keepers. We turned for home at 3:15 after a day of non-stop action.

THREE SIMPLE ACTIONS TO IMPROVE YOUR CATCH BY Basil Dubrosky

Did you ever wonder why, on the same day, at the same time, other fishermen catch more fish than you do? Did you ever have a big one get away and wonder why? Do you often get bites but no fish? Although we know that luck plays a big part in fishing success, there are 3 things you can do to markedly improve your luck.

There is seldom a bait that is too fresh, a hook too sharp or a knot too good to be improved, however, many fishermen think that the rig they have on when they leave the dock or reach the beach and the first bait they put on the hook should last them until they land a fish.

Hooks should be checked for sharpness frequently by spearing the point into your thumbnail. If it hooks the thumbnail without sliding it is good, if not, sharpen it. A portable sharpening stone is as handy as a clipper and should be kept on a lanyard or within easy reach. Experienced fishermen, whether fresh water or salt, artificial or bait, will tell you that sharp hooks dramatically improve your catch.

Chemically treated hooks such as Gamagatsu come factory sharp and are the most effective hooks for sharpness out of the package. These hooks do dull up with repeated use (especially on the beach) and are more difficult to sharpen. I usually throw them away after they go dull.

Most non-chemically treated hooks will not pass the sharpness test out of the package and should be sharpened before use. These hooks should be checked often and at the least be replaced after each saltwater fishing trip.

Live bait should be replaced when it dies and dead bait should be freshened regularly. If you are not catching fish, change your bait frequently, this will also allow you to check for seaweed and fouled hooks. The salt water takes the freshness out of bait and bait should not be used for prolonged periods.

Use fresh tippet material and new knots before each fishing trip. This may sound extreme but it is inexpensive and it will prevent those guilt feelings you may have about your tackle after losing a big fish. Retie knots periodically during your trip. The knot nearest the bait takes a beating and should periodically be freshened. If you conscientiously follow the 3 simple actions above, you will dramatically improve your fishing results and decrease those guilt feelings if you have a bad day.


