The rules are simple: you have to catch a fish of the above species, take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. If you have weighed in the largest fish of a particular species for the calendar year 2012, then you win the FOY trophy for that species. Note: your dues have to be paid before you catch an eligible fish.

**FISHING REPORT** by Joe Filice for September 8, 2012.

Word was fluke on north side of the jetties. My youngest son, Mike and I hit the beach at 9:00. The Jetty I wanted to fish had two guys already fishing the north side and pulling in fluke. We tried the south side with nothing. I looked south and noted that the next jetty down was empty. So we hoofed it down the beach and set up on the north side fishing a plain 1 oz. jig with a white teaser. Both baited with white 4" Gulp swimming mullet. MIKE'S second cast yielded a 20" from the wash just off the beach. Over the next hour and a half we caught two-dozen fluke with four keepers from 18" to 20". I lost several larger fish in the wash. Believe we could have limited out, but had company coming and had to leave the fish biting.

### **FISHING REPORT** by Bill Dabney

I broke the LE Inlet at 7:30 AM on September 2nd. With me was my son in law Darryl Ball and my grandson Kevin Ball. The Intel from Scotty, of Scott's Bait and Tackle, Thanks Scotty, was that the fish were holding in the deeper water in and around the AC Reef. We decided to fish this area. Little did I know this was going to be not only a fishing day but also a great catching day. We drifted several sites and picked up keeper fish right away. The bait of choice was 6 in gulp mullet white, chartreuse and pink. Like Capt. Brett Taylor preaches if you're not losing rigs you're not catching fish and we lost our share, but we ended up with ten keepers up to 24 in. I overheard my grandson tell his father that this was better than fishing any of the party boats out of Atlantic Highlands.... Made my day.

### **FISHING REPORT** by Brett Taylor August 16, 2012

Midweek, I had the John Ways charter (2 Pictures included) fishing some areas close to the inlet - they ended up with 10 keepers. Three of these fish were around 5lbs - with the biggest measuring 24". Most of the fish were caught on my custom rigs with the "secret" scented strips. The bay is still holding some fish - but most keep able fish are being caught close to the inlet - with the bigger ones hanging around structure or depth changes. I can say it enough if you're not losing rigs, then you're not fishing in the right areas.

### **FISHING REPORT** by Brett Taylor August 12<sup>th</sup>.

Over the weekend, I had the opportunity to fish the Make a Wish Tournament ran by South Harbor Marina in Waretown. South Harbor owner Tom Mackie and family do a superb job of running this event. My father and I ended up with 10 keepers with our two heaviest fish having a combined weight of 7.92lb - good enough for 12th place out of 120 boats. We ran south of the inlet in 55-60 ft of water. Most of the fish bigger fish were caught on Mahi-Mahi strips on bucktails or rigs. I have included the picture - only eight are showing - we gave two fluke away.

**FISHING REPORT** by Basil Dubrosky for July 31, 2012

I departed the dock on my boat, Togman with Bill Dabney at 6:30 AM. We headed for the Middle Grounds to fish for Weakfish. It was overcast with a stiff wind out of the East. We had a good drift with very little grass. We used fresh shedder crab or small squid strips over Gulp on 1/4-ounce jigs with light spin fishing gear. The shedder scent brought in the Weaks and we were able to catch 8 fish. We also caught Sea Robbins, a large dogfish, sand sharks and 2 short fluke. All fish were returned to the water

**FISHING REPORT** by Basil Dubrosky

On July 14, Russell Denton, Bill Dabney and I went out on my boat, "Togman" as part of the Sunshine Foundation Fluke and Bluefish tournament. This is a great multi-species tournament to benefit a great charity with a picnic and festivities at Great Bay Marina afterwards. It reminds me of the annual, End of Summer tournament that the VHFC would run in the old days.

We departed the dock at 6 AM in calm, cloudy weather. We headed out the main channel of Little Egg Inlet and went to a wreck about 8 miles out. A dive boat was just setting up anchor as we drifted the structure. As the divers got ready to hit the water, we departed, without a

hit, to give them the required privacy. We headed to the Little Egg Reef where we set up over the VHFC Charlie Kochka tank. There was no drift and no fish activity. It was so calm that I was able to view the tank clearly on my fish finder. I was able to raise a couple small fluke with a power drift but the action was very slow. None of the other boats around us were catching fish, only an occasional skate. I headed over to the Atomic Lump near the LE Buoy but conditions were the same and no fish biting.

Finally, I headed back into the main channel of the inlet in order to find some moving water. We got the last bit of the outgoing tide and caught about 6 shorts. We returned to the dock about 2:30. I was too tired for the picnic but Bill and his wife went over to the picnic and had an enjoyable time. There was good food, beer and raffles and drawings. Bill's wife even won one of the drawings.

**FISHING REPORT** by John Kleban for July 28, 2012.

For several years Paul Galasso and I have been fishing Bluefish Tournaments. This year we have fished 4 Tournaments (so far). Each one of these Tournaments are for a very worthy charity. The Greater Atlantic Bluefish Tournament (GABT) is for families that need help. The other three are for disabled children. Besides being for a very worthy charity the tournaments are a wealth of information. It causes the crew to function as a team and also allows one to see the results of many other fishermen's fishing ventures. We had a very interesting time in the GABT. There were about 65 boats entered and only about 75 Bluefish caught. Two boats had about 50 fish between them and the other 63 boats had about 25 fish between them. We only had 2 fish but still finished a very respectable 7th place. Time management is a very important part of the tournaments and this is where the team effort works best. In the GABT one boat at 1 minute to 4:00 PM said he was 2 minutes away from the committee boat. The rules are that the committee boat must see the entry prior to 4:00 PM. He was 1 minute late and

disqualified. We got stuck behind a boat under tow in the channel at 15 minutes before 4:00 PM and notified the committee boat where we at since he could not see us. Luckily he gave us the benefit of the doubt. In the Sunshine Tournament we were very fortunate to catch the two largest fish entered. Yesterday we were entered in the Absecon fishing tournament. As before all tournaments we check entries in the logbooks for that time of years going back many years. After developing a plan we try and follow it with some backup in the background. We went to the place where we caught the fish in the Sunshine Tournament, but quickly found out it was loaded with grass. There were bait reading so we tried to find clear patches of water in that area. After an hour and a half it was decided to move to another area. Over thirty years ago I did a lot of shark fishing 30 to 40 miles east of LBI. My logbooks are loaded with Loran number of where the Sharks were caught. Bluefish were always present. Paul suggested a move to a new location and I agreed since more than 30 years ago I had excellent results at this location. We move there and were rewarded with over a dozen Bluefish over ten pounds. We were able to leave early and have plenty of time to get to the weigh-in station. As we started to travel down the Parkway we go caught in a sever downpour which brought the traffic to a standstill. The clock kept moving but luckily so did we to make the weigh-in. Just after the weigh-in closed an angler drove up and was notified he was too late. He quickly drove away. There was only one other Bluefish weigh-in at about 3 pounds. The contest was for the combined weight of three fish so we won this, but it took lots of work and diligent logbook entries.

**PAN FRIED FLOUNDER / FLUKE PICATTA** by Vince Sibona

4 skinless, boneless flounder fillets  
Black pepper (to taste)  
1/2 cup cooking oil (canola, veg. or peanut)  
1/4 cup parmesan cheese  
1 cup seasoned breadcrumbs  
1/2 cup all-purpose flour  
2 tablespoons granulated garlic  
2 tablespoons real butter (cold)  
1/4 cup heavy whipping cream  
Angel hair pasta  
1 lemon  
2 tablespoons capers (drained)

Rinse the 4 fillets and pat dry. Sprinkle with black pepper to taste.

In a bowl mix parmesan cheese, breadcrumbs, flour and granulated garlic. Add your fish to the mixture and cover well.

Start cooking the angel hair pasta. Heat a large frying pan to medium high, add the oil and heat to about 340 degrees. Once you have the desired temperature, add the fish and cook for 3 minutes, (plus or minus), on each side so you get golden brown color.

When the flounder fillets are cooked, serve them over the drained angel hair pasta.

To make complementary sauce, pour off the excess oil in pan, then add lemon juice, capers, butter and cream. Reduce the heat to low and gently whisk for about 2 minutes. If needed, add a little more parmesan cheese to thicken the sauce. Pour the sauce over the fish and pasta dish.

A resinous wrap is installed around the damaged pile and dry concrete is poured into a specially formed spout. The concrete disperses and fills in the voids in the piling caused by the shipworms. The piling, after the concrete sets, is now restored with a ten year warranty.
