(Vessel Safety)

We have all heard the saying of "leaving sleeping dogs lie" and that may be true when dealing with certain situations. This month I am going to direct a portion of this column to an article that appeared in the latest issue of "Seaworthy, written by Frank Lanier entitled "Capt. Frank's Sea Chest of Horrors". Mr. Lanier is a marine surveyor and he describes what can happen should we decide to "let the dogs lie" with an attitude of "out-of-sight, out-of-mind" type of maintenance on our vessels. With some of our members getting our boats back into the water after taking a year off to deal with "Sandy" issues, we may be in for some surprises. While all of might not pertain to us directly, it should give us some food for thought.

One our yearly checks of our vessel is our marine radio. Sea Tow has an Automated Radio Check Service. This service allows us to check the functioning of the VHF radio as often as necessary. The Channel for this area is Channel 27. Go to https://www.seatow.com/tools-andeducation/automated-radio-check. They have a video on how it works. While your checking your radio, take the next step and should it be equips with Digital Selective Calling aka "DSC", add an additional function to your safety if you have not do it already. Register you boat/radio with a Maritime Mobile Service Identity (also called MMSI). Should you find yourself in a distress situation, this service when connected to your GPS will send an alert to the Coast Guard. Go the Boat/ US website as follows:

Enough of the serious stuff. There is more than likely an "X-Box" or some other equal in our house. If you are like me, I haven't mastered it or really have tried it. I was surfing thru some of my favorite fishing web sites and stopped at the Recreational Fishing Alliance website (<u>www.oinrfa.org</u>). Since I have not been here in a while, I gave it a closer look. Under the "New" tab, I found an article entitled" Obama Faces Whale of Opposition in NJ. This article reference the seismic testing program that is just 15 miles East of Barnegat Light. It was to have started on June 2 and is expected to last into August.

This was approved by the Obama Administration as a study for climate change to access deep-sea sediments. The fishing community is still reacting from the effects of Superstorm Sandy and they feel that the explosive study will scatter the fish while also having harming effects to the migratory species such as gray whales, humpbacks along with the right whales that are along our coast.

Another article deals with the Vote on HR 4742. This one deals with the flexibility of the Fisheries Management and a vote against it would be a vote against the fishing community.

I am not going to comment either for against either one of these articles, but the point is that we as sportsmen have a responsibility to ourselves and our brothers and sisters to keep aware of what is happening on the political front. Each month, Dave Spendiff presents a report on what is happening in regards to fishing regulations in NJ. While the visible immediate effects may be here in our backyard, the far-reaching effects may lie beyond our state boundary.

I encourage everyone to go to the RFA website along with those of similar information so that we can make sound decisions.

Being a little bit of a history buff and also a member of the IGFA, I had a few minutes to look into the beginning of this organization. I will wager that many of you did not know its beginnings.

Take a phrase form the IGFA, "Before 1939 there was not a uniform wide code of sporting ethics to guide ocean anglers in their pursuit" That was about to change.

It seems that at about the same time, an American by the name of Michael Lerner was planning a fishing trip to fish the waters of Australia and New Zealand in partnership with the American Museum of Natural History. It was during this trip that he caught up with Clive Firth. (Clive Firth was one of the top Australian sportsmen of the day and together). They discussed and idea of organizing an association that would promote international cooperation of sport fishing. In looking over this history, the name of "Michael Lerner" kept ringing a bell in my head. You see growing up in the Central Jersey Area and having relatives in Perth Amboy, I was frequently dragged into a certain store by my mom, my aunt or my grandmother by the name of Lerner's Clothing Store". It seems that at the same time. Michael was a founder, along with his brothers of the national

chain of "Lerner's Clothing Store". Now the fireworks went off with asking myself could this be the same person? Well the answer was yes it was. It seems that he had left the business to continue his interest of the science of game fish and conservation. Through his work, along with other scholars, anglers and conservationist, the beginning of the IGFA was on its way. The rest of the story can be found at the IFGA website (www.igfa.org/Museum). Some other names that are in the Hall of Fame include besides Michael Lerner are his wife Helen Lerner, Ernest Hemingway, Zane Grey, John and Kay Rybovich, Mary Orvis Marbury and may others. The second is <u>Estimating</u> Monofilament <u>Backing</u> When Using Braided Spectra



How much monofilament <u>backing</u> will i need beneath my <u>braided line</u> top-shot?

This is a nifty <u>mathematics</u> calculation on how to estimate how much monofilament backing you will need to use with <u>braided line</u> top-shots.

In this situation we are using a <u>Shimano Sustain</u> 5000 spool which holds 200 yards of 12 lb monofilament. and we want to use a 150 yard top-shot of 20 lb braided line.

How much monofilament backing do you need to fill the spool space?
