As many of know I also perform the Vessel Safety Checks for USCG Auxiliary. While the season is coming to the end, Think about having one done next year. This is a no cost service and assists each boater to have the minimum safety equipment on board.

If successfully qualifying, a decal gets place on your vessel. If you do not qualify, no fear, I does not get reported and we will discuss the items and I will come back and do it all again. The advantages to displaying a decal are that should you get stopped and boarded by the Coast **Guard** it allows them know that you take safety seriously and you may also get a discount on your oat insurance. With your name, phone number or email address, length of vessel and location and we will set up a date. Hope to hear from every member.

From our past:

December 10, 2005

A Last Hurrah

On December 10th, Bill Dabney and I went down to the marina to take his boat out of the water for the season. With true fishermen's optimism, though, we hoped the weather would allow us to get one last shot at the stripers for the year. We stopped at Scott's bait shop on the way and got a report from his dad that there was some striper action off the Beach Haven towers.

When we got to the dock, about 9 AM, the weather was crisply cold, but calm and sunny. Things looked good except for some skim ice that had formed in the lagoon. Great Bay itself, though, was open. Bill's Parker, appropriately named "Ice Wine", carved right through to the bay and we headed down to the old Coast Guard station. We started out by anchoring at a rip there where we had had some good fishing earlier in the season. Not today though. Nothing on the fish finder and no bites to be had.

By that time the sun had warmed things up and we had a radio report from a few boats off of the towers that there was a lot of bird action and breaking fish outside. So off we went. On the way out we saw enormous schools of fish on the finder just outside the inlet, probably croakers or herring, in about 20 feet of water. No sign, though, of birds or breaking fish. When we got off the towers everything was calm. No boats, birds, or fish. We did a little casting around without any results. Then the radio kicked in and reported the fish had moved further north. Off we went again, until we finally caught up with them, off Brant Beach.

What a scene! The fish finder lit up from top to bottom. Birds diving and screaming over several acres of water with fish breaking all around us. In the middle of the afternoon yet. We started casting with Hopkins spoons and jigs, and both worked. A striper and a blue at first and then all stripers. Just under the surface or down deep, it didn't seem to matter. We ended up with 3 slot

fish and about a dozen just short of that, and lost a whole lot more. We were hooked up on almost every cast!

And then, at about 3 PM, it was as if someone turned off a switch. It was over. The bite stopped, the birds disappeared, and we were left sitting in a calm ocean. So we turned back in, heading for drydock, smiles on our faces, and already looking forward to next year. What a way to end the season!!



ATTENTION NEW JERSEY BOATERS APPROVED BOATING SAFETY COURSE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE!

THE "NEW JERSEY BOAT OPERATOR"
IS APPROVED AND AUTHORIZED BY THE
NJ STATE POLICE MARINE SERVICES BUREAU

In New Jersey, all persons operating any powerboat or PWC (jet ski, sea doo, etc.) must have proof of passing an approved boating safety education course. All operators, regardless of age, must possess an approved boating safety education certificate.

GET YOUR NEW JERSEY BOATER CARD IN 3 EASY STEPS

- Take and pass the New Jersey Boat Operator Online Boating Safety Education Course and print your *Proof of Completion* document
- Call and schedule an appointment to take the final exam at any our approved testing centers.
- 3. Show your 'Proof of Completion' document at the testing center along with a photo ID. The final exam must be taken in person and a passing score of 70% or better is required to obtain your New Jersey Education Certificate. BS Co. F. Barris Safing Carlse.
