At this meeting, they will hear final public comment on proposed regulations for fluke, sea bass and the striped bass bonus program and decide what the regulations will be. You will have little justification to complain about the outcome if you don't attend and make your feelings known. Look at the Regulatory/Legislative section in our newsletter for more detail.

The same seven species will continue for our

2015 Trophy Fish of the Year Program.

The rules are simple: you have to catch a fish of the above species, take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. If you have weighed in the largest fish of a particular species for the calendar year 2015 then you win the FOY trophy for that species. **Note:** your dues have to be paid before you catch an eligible fish.

THE LEGISLATIVE REPORT

This month's Legislative reports can be found throughout the newsletter

1) Fluke: There will be a 128 day season in 2015 with a 5 fish bag limit of a minimum 18". The decision the NJMFC will have to make at the April 9th meeting in Manahawkin is, when the season begins and ends. The options are:

- a) Opens May 16th ends September 20th
- **b)** Opens May 22th ends September 26th

The JCAA favors "b" as it will keep the season open later in the season when there is little else to fish for before the stripers arrive.


- 2) Striped Bass: The 2015 regulation will be 1 fish at a minimum of 28" to less than 43" and a second fish of 43" or greater. What has not been decided is the Bonus Bass Program size limit. This will be decided at the April 9th NJMFC meeting in Manahawkin after public comment. The options to be considered are:
 - a) 1 fish between 24-28"
 - **b)** 1 fish at a minimum of 28" or greater

The JCAA favors option "b" to help protect the very large 2011 year class of bass that will be reaching the 24-28" size in a few years. They want this year class to spawn at least once before being harvested.

3) Sea Bass: The options here are more complex as they deal with size, bag limit and length of season. The 3 options are as follows: (See Chart)

The JCAA favors option 3 as it increases the season to 175 days (38 days longer than option 1), which would begin on the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend and extend through the Sunday of Labor Day weekend. This still achieves the 33% mandated reduction by simply adding ½" to size limit. The JCAA believes that option 3 is the best option for recreational anglers whether they fish on charter, party or private boats.

Please attend the NJMFC meeting at 4PM on April 9th at the Stafford Municipal Building, 260 East Bay Ave, Manahawkin, NJ and voice your opinions on these regulations.

The second is <u>Estimating</u> Monofilament <u>Backing</u> When Using Braided Spectra



How much monofilament <u>backing</u> will i need beneath my <u>braided line</u> top-shot?

This is a nifty <u>mathematics</u> calculation on how to estimate how much monofilament backing you will need to use with <u>braided line</u> top-shots.

In this situation we are using a <u>Shimano Sustain</u> 5000 spool which holds 200 yards of 12 lb monofilament. and we want to use a 150 yard top-shot of 20 lb braided line.

How much monofilament backing do you need to fill the spool space?

ATTENTION NEW JERSEY BOATERS APPROVED BOATING SAFETY COURSE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE!

THE "NEW JERSEY BOAT OPERATOR"
IS APPROVED AND AUTHORIZED BY THE
NJ STATE POLICE MARINE SERVICES BUREAU

In New Jersey, all persons operating any powerboat or PWC (jet ski, sea doo, etc.) must have proof of passing an approved boating safety education course. All operators, regardless of age, must possess an approved boating safety education certificate.

<u>GET YOUR NEW JERSEY BOATER CARD IN 3 EASY STEPS</u>

- Take and pass the New Jersey Boat Operator Online Boating Safety Education Course and print your "Proof of Completion" document."
- Call and schedule an appointment to take the final exam at any our approved testing centers.
- 3. Show your 'Proof of Completion" document at the testing center along with a photo ID. The final exam must be taken in person and a passing score of 70% or better is required to obtain your New Jersey Education Certificate.
