PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hi everyone,

It is with some embarrassment that I pass on to you the new nickname I've been given by the fishermen in my family. I do this only because I believe in the founding purpose of educating that started this club some 26 years ago. I'll give you the name later on, but the fishing trip that led to it started at 3:45AM, August 6th when I left my dock to fish the middle grounds for weakfish and fluke. I had 4 rods rigged, 2 lighter weight spinning rods rigged with pink soft jerk baits and 2 conventional rods set up for fishing for fluke with bait. I arrived at my spot at the first signs of light in the East and with a couple of hours left on the outgoing tide. I started my drifts casting for weakfish without a

touch for the first hour and three quarters – NADA! I switched to fishing for fluke with fresh spearing, squid, gulp, and fish bellies on buck tails and hi-lo rigs – NADA, not a touch! On one of my drifts. I noticed some surface action around a "no wake" buoy and figured I would make a few casts around the buoy to see if I could hook into something, anything! On the second cast with the pink BKD I caught a light silvery fish with faint bars on its flat sides that fought pretty well for its 9 to 10 inch size. I had absolutely no idea what it was, but they were hitting and I was in a catching mood so I continued to cast and catch until the turn of the tide when they stopped biting and I moved on farther South to catch a 12" fluke (1st of the year) on an incoming tide drift.

We have Jeff Dement of the American Littoral Society as our guest speaker this month and you'll have only one more meeting to buy raffle tickets for the Tony Maja outrodders and the St. Croix spinning rod donated by fellow member, Manny Silva.

We have scheduled a club fluke tournament for September 12th with a \$5.00 entry fee per fisherman. There will be 2 largest fish prizes: 1st

Prize = 75% of total entry money and 2nd Prize =

25% of total entry money. The fish must be caught in the bay (Barnegat to Great Bay) and all fish must be weighed in at one of our weigh stations on 9/12/15 to qualify. Prize money will be awarded at our October meeting. We will have more information and a signup sheet at Friday's meeting.

Now is the time to sign up for our annual dinner to be held at the Villaggio's restaurant on the evening of September 19, 2015. No one will have more fun in Manahawkin that night for \$36.00 than we will, particularly with the option to bring your own bottle! Hope to see a big turn out!

We will be meeting in a new location starting this Friday since the old building has been demolished. The same parking area is available, but the meeting will take place in the building on the corner west of the parking lot at 25 Pine St.

Oh yea, the nickname! After a trip to the library to discover the species of fish I caught almost 20 of and phone conversations with my fishing children and grandchildren, I am now known as the "Grand Croaker"! Just no respect anymore!!!


This month's speaker is Jeff Dement of the American Littoral Society

2015 Trophy Fish of the Year Program.

The rules are simple: you have to catch a fish of the above species, take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. If you have weighed in the largest fish of a particular species for the calendar year 2015 then you win the FOY trophy for that species. **Note:** your dues have to be paid before you catch an eligible fish.

ATTENTION NEW JERSEY BOATERS APPROVED BOATING SAFETY COURSE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE!

THE "NEW JERSEY BOAT OPERATOR"
IS APPROVED AND AUTHORIZED BY THE
NJ STATE POLICE MARINE SERVICES BUREAU

In New Jersey, all persons operating any powerboat or PWC (jet ski, sea doo, etc.) must have proof of passing an approved boating safety education course. All operators, regardless of age, must possess an approved boating safety education certificate.

GET YOUR NEW JERSEY BOATER CARD IN 3 EASY STEPS

- Take and pass the New Jersey Boat Operator Online Boating Safety Education Course and print your "Proof of Completion" document.
- Call and schedule an appointment to take the final exam at any our approved testing centers.
- 3. Show your 'Proof of Completion' document at the testing center along with a photo ID. The final exam must be taken in person and a passing score of 70% or better is required to obtain your New Jersey Education Certificate.
