2018 TROPHY FISH OF THE YEAR (FOY) - Just a reminder - If you catch a Striped Bass, Bluefish, Seabass, Tautog, Weakfish or Fluke take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. The fisherman who catches the largest fish of each species for 2018 will be awarded the FOY trophy for that species.

2018 TROPHY FISH OF THE MONTH (FOM) - Since I have no information regarding official weigh-ins for the June striped bass and bluefish FOM awards, I cannot announce the winners at this time. Once again, the largest fish caught during the month will be awarded a \$50 gift certificate to Fisherman's Headquarters (no expiration) so be sure to enter your catch. FOM weigh-ins are made the same as FOY weigh-ins. There are 15 remaining FOM awards for 2018 including fluke and sea bass which started in May as shown below. Fluke and Sea Bass are the June FOM candidates.

There were ten reports submitted in May. Reports do not always have to be about your own personal fishing or having made a great catch. Marty Friedrich's report relayed information from a friend's outing targeting early bluefish. Donna Harris reported just a small bass one day and nothing the next on the beach. Dave Spendiff lamented about the small (by his standards) bluefish. But all these reports convey important information to club members.

Of course, the fantastic beach report and catch from Pat Presutto was certainly impressive. Pat caught his striper in Surf City. It was 37.5 inches and weighed in at 22.64 lbs.



The "Dodds" family went sea bass fishing with Captain Greg Carr on the Kev'N Ash II. Bob, his son Shawn and 15 year old granddaughter Ashley had a great day fishing the ocean outside of Barnegat Light. They had a boat limit of sea bass with the biggest over 17" and 2+ pounds. They also caught and released over 10 nice sized tog, a cod, several ling and some nasty doggies.



Phil Simon fished the bay opening day of fluke. No action at the BI and #40 buoy resulted in a move to the Research Buoy. After algae on the bottom kept fouling his bucktail and teaser, Phil switched to a white floating jig with a white gulp swim shad as mentioned last month. He started picking up shorts in the 14 - 16 range and finally landed a nice 22 inch keeper.



Marty Friedrich and his two pals had a great opening day in Great Bay. They limited out with 15 throwbacks. Two fish were 22.5 inches including one weighing over 4.5 lbs! That's the way to set the pace for 2018.



Yes I know he looks familiar but Pat Presutto caught another beauty! This one went 42.75 inches and weighed 28 lbs 1 oz. So far, Pat holds third place in the Surf City store tournament and the LBI spring derby. He puts a lot of time on the beach and certainly knows surf fishing!

MONTHLY HANDS ON

There was an interesting article in the June edition of On The Water magazine called Caring For Your Catch. The first point was about bleeding your catch. Besides removing blood, bleeding your fish quickly dispatches it and minimizes the buildup of lactic acid while the fish struggles. While I always bleed bluefish and striper, the article stated you should bleed all fish including fluke, seabass and tog.

For large fish, simply insert your knife through the gills and gently cut downward. You will immediately know when you hit the bloodline. Do this over your cooler or be ready to wash off your boat. For smaller fish, reach under the gill plate and tear the gills. But be careful of the sharp edges! A few years back during one of my many Tokyo business trips, I visited the famed Tsukiji fish market. There at 4:30 AM, someone was buying what appeared to be a 17" fluke (Hirame at Sushi restaurants). Once weighed, the fishmonger reached into the gills with a hook shaped utensil and severed them. Then almost as fast, he brought a cleaver down across the base of the tail and neatly chopped through the dark side to the spine while leaving the tail still attached. The fish then went into a plastic bag with ice where I'm sure every part of it was consumed later.

That leads to their next point - ice your catch. Very simple to do. With all the money spent on your boat, fuel and tackle do not skip this step to save a few bucks. Better yet, freeze milk containers and reuse them next trip after a quick rinse off.

Lastly, as you fillet your fish, drop them into salt water to rinse off. I keep a bucket handy for that purpose. If saltwater isn't available, tap water - as is or with some added salt - is still worth doing. For striper and bluefish, I remove the dark meat with a sharp fillet knife - why would



anyone use a dull one - as shown in the photo. If you're not comfortable doing that, cutting the fillet lengthwise will make removing the dark meat easier. If you enjoy the stronger flavored meat, then just leave it alone.

MONTHLY TIP

Everyone knows to rinse off their rods and reels with fresh water after a day of fishing. Folks also know to loosen their drags when the reels are put back into storage so that the drag washers are not compressed. A few years back while making the run to the fluke grounds, I looked back to see one of my reels completely emptied with the line only attached by the reel knot! I quickly stopped and retrieved my 100+ yards of braid. I guess my bouncing boat caused the jig to free up and hit the water where my reel quickly emptied. What a near disaster! The line could have wrapped around my prop or simply broke off and deposited itself in the bay.

So be sure to tighten all drags before putting your rods in your boat or car rod holders. Even better, attach your lure or hook to a nail or other suitable attachment and set the drag with your rod arched to simulate a hooked fish. I think this is more accurate than just pulling the line straight out from the reel.



2018 FISHING REGULATIONS

BLACK DRUM: No closed season, **3** fish at 16" (Proposed 32" size limit pending hearings)

BLACK SEABASS: May 15 to June 22, **10** fish at 12.5"; July 1 to August 31, **2** fish at 12.5"; October 8 to October 31, **10** fish at 12.5"; November 1 to December 31, **15** fish at 13"

BLUE CRAB: 3" minimum size for peeler/shedder 3-1/2" for soft shell 4-1/2" hard shell

BLUEFISH: No closed season, 15 fish, no min. size

COBIA: No closed season, **2** fish at 37" (no possession in Federal waters)

COD & HADDOCK: No closed season, no creel limit, 21" min. size

FLUKE: May 25 – September 22, **3** fish at 18" (same rules for IBSP and Delaware Bay as 2017

KING MACKEREL: No closed season, 3 fish at 23"

POLLACK: No closed season, no creel limit, 19" min. size

PORGY: 50 fish at 9"; 1/1 - 2/28 & 7/1 - 12/31

RED DRUM: No closed season, 1 fish from 18" to 27"

SPANISH MACKEREL: No closed season, 10 fish at 14"

STRIPED BASS: No closed season, **1** fish from 28" to less than 43", **1** fish greater than 43" - NJ waters only (0-3 miles out)

TAUTOG: Min. size 15": **4** fish 1/1 - 2/28; **4** fish 4/1 - 4/30; **1** fish 7/17 - 11/15; **6** fish 11/16 -

12/31

WEAKFISH: No closed season, 1 fish at 13"

WINTER FLOUNDER: 3/1 - 12/31/18, 2 fish at 12"
