Hi everyone,

Well the summer of 2018 is definitely moving along! If you consider our summer season as June-July-August-September then we are definitely over the peak now in August. The changes will be subtle at first but you will begin to notice them. Within a few weeks, the crowds will start thinning out as kids have early school sports activities. The weather will be a little less hot and humid and heat waves usually won't last as long. Lastly, daylight is noticeably getting shorter. The tables for Atlantic City show June 21 had 14 hrs 56 minutes of daylight. July 21 dropped to 14 hrs 41 minutes - 15 minutes less. However, August 21 will only have 13 hrs 28 minutes of daylight - 88 minutes less than June 21st! We all know where this headed so make the best of your daytime opportunities.

Just about everything is in play during August. The bay has snappers, blues, small stripers, fluke, blowfish, sharks, clams and crabs. The surf offers kingfish, blues and fluke with the near shore ocean adding seabass, sharks, maybe some bonito & false albacore soon as well as

offshore tuna and other pelagics. According to the latest edition of *The Fisherman*, our jetties and sod banks have triggerfish, porgies, sheepshead and tog (1 fish @15" from 8/1 to 11/15). So get out there and make the most of what this fine area has to offer. As always be sure to weigh-in your catch for our FOM / FOY awards and submit a report of your success for others to enjoy reading.

AUGUST SPEAKER - This month's speaker is **Jim Hutchinson Jr**. – Jim is a former Managing Director of the Recreational Fishing Alliance (RFA), a national political action organization dedicated to safeguarding the rights of saltwater anglers. After 6 years with RFA, Jim rejoined *The Fisherman* family in early 2015, as Managing Editor. Jim is also a former trustee at the Tuckerton Seaport and Museum and president of the Long Beach Island Surf Fishing Classic Committee. Jim spends much of his fishing time from the beaches of LBI to the backwaters of Little Egg and Great Bay.

I just wanted to comment about the scale used for the weigh ins since it appears that it may have been off slightly. However, all contending fish were weighed on the same scale and therefore, all received a weight relative to each other. If you look at the weigh ins for July on our website https://vhfishingclub.com/conteststournaments/vhfc-standings/ you will see two entries for 14 July: Marty's fish (1st place at 3 lbs 14 oz at the BBQ) weighed 4 lbs 0 oz when entered at Creekside Outfitters and Bob Klebosis' fish (2nd place at 3 lbs 10 oz at the BBQ) also weighed 4 lbs 0 oz when entered at BHW Marine Center. Once again, both fish were weighed on the same scale at the BBQ so there should not be any issue regarding who won the contest. Regarding the July FOM winner, Marty weighed in a 4 lb 13 oz fluke later in the month. Next year, we will verify and calibrate the scale used for weigh ins before the contest.

2018 NEW JERSEY MARINE FISHING REGULATION

The following letter was written by Dave Spendiff on behalf of VHFC members and sent to the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council.

Director Moore,

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Village Harbour Fishing Club which is composed of more than 100 members and is based in Manahawkin, New Jersey. I would like to take this opportunity to express our club's opinion on the amendment that is currently being developed by the ASMFC and the MAFMC regarding the Bluefish Fishery Management Plan.

We favor maintaining the existing bluefish allocation between the recreational and commercial fisherman of 83% - 17% respectively. We believe the trend of catch and release in the recreational fishing community has led to the under fishing of the recreational bluefish quota. Our members look forward to the spring run of large migratory bluefish that enter Barnegat and Great Bay in April. We fish for, catch and release these fish, but keep very few. In fact, my son travels up from Maryland every weekend during this run. A run that, unfortunately, did not happen this year – hopefully they simply passed us by!

With the fact that the spawning stock biomass is below target for bluefish, we are at a loss to understand why the ASMFC and MAFMC would even be considering the transfer of the recreational shortfall to the commercial fisherman instead of leaving well enough alone and

rebuild the fishery. We would hope that you would wait until after the next stock assessment before considering any changes.

The Village Harbour Fishing Club wants the bluefish fishery left alone with quotas unchanged to build the stock on the back of recreational fisherman's catch shortfall.
