Hello VHFC Members,

Finally, we will be able to hold an in-person meeting at the Community Center (CC) on June 11th.and I definitely look forward to seeing everyone. Zoom was a workable solution but I am glad that it is no longer required. As an added treat, the CC stated that *"masks are no longer required if you have been fully vaccinated. As our waters continue to warm up, sharks, tuna, cobia, mahi, sheepshead, triggerfish etc, will all start to arrive for the catching.

One precaution for all the boaters out there. This has been a banner year for both used and new boat sales. That means our already crowded waterways will have additional first time boat owners on them especially on the weekends. Take your time and have a little patience!

YOUR PRESIDENT BROKE THE LAW - Relax, I'm not talking about the 'big guy in DC', FOX News covers that. I'm talking about yours truly. Let me explain. On Sunday May 23rd, I was fishing in my boat with Caesar Pesarini and Phil Kaplan in a very crowded and narrow section of High Bar Harbor. I paid no attention to the approaching police boat until their lights were flashing. The two officers announced they were NJ F&W and asked if they could come aboard. Once aboard, they asked about the fishing and I said we had caught several shorts and I had one keeper. They looked at my fish and quickly said it was ok but measured it anyway. As they were about to leave, one of them pointed to my rod and asked what was on my jig. I said it was fluke belly and quickly thought 'Oh S**t''. Of course I didn't have the carcass but showed them the baggie with the salted and almost still frozen remaining strips in my cooler.

Long story short, the officers could have written tickets for every piece of belly but wrote only one for \$54. They said it was like a parking ticket and would not be on my record if mailed in promptly. These guys were courteous and professional throughout. Honestly, I'm glad to see them on the water doing their job. I knew the law but chose to ignore it.

Now, what do I do in the future? Options are:

- 1. Discontinue using fluke bellies **No way!**
- 2. Continue disregarding the law assuming lightning never strikes twice Dumb idea!
- 3. Be on the lookout for an approaching NJ F&W boat. Worst case, cut your line and enjoy the salty sashimi snack in your cooler **Too dumb to even comment!**
- 4. Fillet your fish. Cut and salt the bellies as usual. Fold the carcass in three and place in a shoprite bag. Freeze with the bellies for your next trip Smart and legal! But remember, the carcass counts as your third fish. Once you have two fish, discard the bellies and carcass to continue fishing. Otherwise, revert to number 3 above!

As the officers were leaving, I asked why of all the boats, they chose to board me. They said my boat looked really nice, I had on a Striper shirt and Caesar had on a sun blocking shirt. I said, "So you profiled us as good fishermen." We all had a laugh and I learned my lesson!

2021 FOM Categories (17 Awards)

For contest entry, **take a photo of your catch with a ruler visible from the nose to the end** of the tail for all species entered. Send your picture to our Weighmaster Pat Presutto at pat1016pat@aol.com with a copy to me at edvalitutto@gmail.com for backup.

Per Weighmaster Pat Presutto: For fish with forked tails, I am going by the inside at the 'v'; for fish with rounded tails I am going to the end. All fish are rounded up to the next 1/4" With our first Kingfish entry, we realized Kingfish have neither a "v" nor a rounded tail. Their tails slope from top to bottom. Therefore, length will be measured to the bottom (longer side) of the tail. See Joe Filice's beautiful 14 1/4" Kingfish photo below.



All fish must be caught off land / surf in Ocean County NJ or from a boat departing and returning to Ocean County NJ. **Fish caught on Brielle party boats do not qualify for entry.**

Bluefish must be 20" minimum for entry. Bonus tag bass can be entered for awards but the photo must show the tag. Bass over 38" can be entered but please take your photo and release it quickly. If no entry is made for a species for a specific award period, the award will be added to the next period that species is offered.

The contest runs from 4:00 to 7:00 PM between 8th and 11th streets in Barnegat Light. Feel free to stop by and enjoy watching some really great kids have a blast on the beach. TROLLING MOTOR INSTALLATION BY ED VALITUTTO - I've been thinking about getting a trolling motor and finally decided to do it. I immediately started reading articles on the internet and there are many to read. A good site is <u>Trolling Motor Technical Resources</u>, <u>Guides and How-to's – TrollingMotors.net</u> If you scroll down the page, there are 33 articles to jump to.for additional information.

The most important calculations are how big a motor (24 or 36 volt) and how long a shaft length is needed. I have a Sea Pro 239 center console and from speaking with other users, I needed a 36 volt motor. My measurement from the gunnel to the water at the bow was 41" so I felt a 72" shaft was right. Since access to the unit wasn't an issue, I wanted a manual deployable unit. There are two major motor manufacturers - Minn Kota and Rhodan - and I could not decide one over the other. BTW, both are busy backfilling orders so you will wait on delivery.. Probably the most important decision is the installation.- DIY or getting someone who knows what they are doing. That was easy - no way was I doing it myself but who could do it?

That problem was solved when a neighbor said "Matt over at Tony's B&T does them". I'd known Matt for a few years and always found him to be pleasant and very knowledgeable. I was very impressed to learn that Matt Mottershead had started <u>Beachview Marine Services</u>, a business serving the LBI area with all their boating needs. Matt concurred with my 36 volt requirement and after stopping by to measure the drop to the water, he also concurred with a 72" shaft. Matt recommended Minn Kota and that decision was made. The best part - he had several motors of various styles and lengths already on back order. He also would take care of everything else - batteries, cables, charger, breaker, etc. I offered to pay for the material upfront but he said not until the job is completed!



It took a few weeks for my motor to arrive and Matt brought it over to do another series of checks for the mounting. What is shown in the photos was done in one long day last week.

The motor is shown mounted on the port side and does not interfere with my bow cleat, lines, hand railing or anchor locker.

The motor is not mounted directly to the deck. Matt supplied a thick aluminum base plate that is mounted securely to the deck and the motor is mounted through the plate. It is very solid.

The left photo shows the battery charger / regulator mounted inside my console and the right photo shows the breaker and ON/OFF switch mounted just inside the hatch to the console. What's missing? The three batteries will be in a battery box mounted in a forward center hold. The ledge for the box was done and the void under the box will be filled with foam - not available until next Tuesday. I'll show the finished battery compartment in the July Newsletter. Give Matt a call at 609 573 1918 or check out his website. He's licensed, insured and has done over 20 motor installations. He arrives as promised and is very meticulous with his work.

RECIPE BY BILL DABNEY - Sauteed Flounder with Lemon Caper Pan Sauce

Ingredients:

- 28 oz flounder fillets
- 1 tablespoon capers, chopped
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon shallots minced

- 1 sprig thyme
- 1/4 cup white wine
- 2 tablespoons butter, cubed
- 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
- flour seasoned with your choice of spices
- salt & pepper

Directions: Dust the fillets with the seasoned flour. Heat the oil and 1 tablespoon butter in a large saute pan. Once the butter tops foaming, add the fish and cook 3 - 4 minutes per side until golden. Remove the fillets and deglaze with the white wine. Add capers, shallots, thyme and remaining butter. Finish with lemon juice to help emulsify the sauce. Season with salt & pepper and pour the sauce over the fish and serve. Enjoy with a nice chilled white wine.
