
Friday November 12 - VHFC Club Meeting

NOVEMBER MEETING - As already mentioned in the President's Report, our November meeting will have pizza for all to enjoy!. New for this year, there will also be a slide show (suggested by Phil Simon) of all pictures from the 2021 season that appeared in the Newsletter or in our Fishing Reports. NEW JERSEY FISHING REGULATIONS by Phil Simon - Not much to report this month from JCAA or the fisheries organizations. JCAA will run its Sports Person of the Year dinner Nov 14th at Yesterday's Family Restaurant in Bayville. Prices are \$85 per person and \$750 for a table of 10. For more info and to make reservations call Don Marantz at 908-347-1434. JCAA president John Toth, and former president Paul Haertel, who are both members of the Mid Atlantic Fishery Management Council Black Sea Bass Advisory Panel, will be pushing for a proposed extension of the black sea bass season to cover the gap between the end of fluke season and the current October re-opening of the black sea bass season starting in 2022. The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Tautog Management Board reports improvements in the tog stock over most of the coast. Although the stock in our area appears to be trending upward, it still remains officially "overfished", meaning the stock numbers are below the desired level. For now it looks like no changes are expected in quotas and bag limits for 2022.

VHFC 2021 PARTY BOAT TRIP - On October 20, 6 VHFC members - Phil Simon, Caesar Passarini, Gene Geld, Marty Friedrich, Tom Siciliano and Ed Valitutto - went on a bottom fishing trip on the party boat Dauntless. The weather was beautiful but the winds kept the boat bouncing all day. The porgies and seabass were hungry but there were a lot of smaller fish that were returned to grow some more. Everyone had an enjoyable day on the water.

VHFC offered a \$50 FHQ certificate for the largest fish. The contenders were Gene Geld with a sizable porgy and Tom Siciliano with a nice seabass. Unfortunately, when I suggested we borrow the mate's balance scale to determine a winner, Tom said he already had his fish filleted so Gene took the award! Despite both Gene and I reminding each other to take pictures, the only photo available was my rendition of Porgy Française taken in my kitchen.





Fish Francaise - fish fillets dipped in a light egg batter, pan fried in butter and EVOO and served with a light lemon wine sauce. The recipe appeared in the August '20 NL and is repeated in this issue.

67th ANNUAL LBI SURF FISHING CLASSIC by Jim Hutchinson Sr - The Long Beach Island Surf Fishing Classic was rolling right along when last week's strong northeast storm arrived, complete with rain, severe winds, and waves as high as 9-feet. The question is what will fishing be like now that the storm has departed our area.

During the first 30 days of the contest, only two striped bass have made it to the tournament scales but no bluefish, or red drum yet. Kingfish, however, cooperated with forty-three officially weighed in for eligible prizes.

The LBI Classic began on October 9 and will run until December 12 with prizes available on a daily, weekly, two-week segment, and grand prizes. Go to <u>Live Results</u> for the latest weigh-ins.

For contest entry, take a photo of your catch with a ruler visible from the nose to the center of the tail, without bunching the tail fin together or counting that little dangler on a seabass, for all species entered except kingfish. Due to their sloping tails, kingfish are measured to the bottom of the tail fin. There are L shaped rulers that make this an easy task to show your catch. MONTHLY RECIPE SUBMITTED BY ED VALITUTTO - Flounder / Chicken Francaise - This is another family favorite that can be made with either fish or chicken. Since my wife

does not like fish, I often start with a few chicken fillets before I cook the fish. The important part is that the fillets are thin.

Ingredients

2 beaten eggs

1 TBS Olive oil

1 TBS Butter

½ Cup Flour

½ TSP Salt

1/2 TSP Onion powder - Optional

1/2 TSP Garlic powder - Optional

½ TSP Paprika - Optional

1/4 TSP Black pepper

4 -6 (1 1/2 to 2 lbs) Flounder fillets

SAUCE

4 TBS Butter

1/4 Cup White wine

1/4 Cup Water

1/4 Cup Lemon juice or less if you prefer less acidity

Capers - optional

Garnish with lemon slices and parsley - optional

In a large skillet, heat the oil and 1 tablespoon of butter over medium heat.

Place the flour and all the seasonings in a plastic bag and shake to blend.

Place the beaten eggs in a shallow dish.

When the skillet is hot, put the flounder fillets in the bag one or two at a time and then dip in the egg. Coat them completely with the egg and place in the skillet. The egg should sizzle immediately. If it doesn't, the oil isn't hot enough.


Save 1 tablespoon of the flour mixture for the sauce.

Saute over medium heat until brown on both sides, about 3 to 4 minutes per side. Add extra butter and oil if needed. Remove from the skillet and keep warm in a 175 oven. Continue until fish has been cooked.

Sauce - Discard any oil left in the skillet and add the 4 TBS butter and the 1 TBS of the reserved seasoned flour. If adding capers, do it now. Whisk until smooth. Add the rest of the sauce ingredients, stirring constantly until well blended. Bring to boil and cook for 5 minutes, stirring frequently. If the sauce thickens too much, add water- just 1 tsp at a time until you achieve the desired consistency.

To serve, place the flounder over a bed of buttered rice or pasta and pour a little sauce over each fillet. Garnish with lemon slices and parsley. I often double the sauce since the rice or pasta will quickly absorb it. Enjoy!

Bill Figley went out on October 1st to fish Little Egg reef.

Bill caught a nice tog that went 18 1/2"



He also caught a nice triggerfish that was just over 15".



Dave Spendiff joined me for an early fall fishing trip south to fish for tog near the Rutgers building and anchored in 20' of water. We caught ~30 tog and 6 small seabass before the crabs were gone. All were small except for the one keeper I got at 16+". We then went north and made several drifts with peanut bunker near Morrison's.

Dave immediately hooked up and reeled in a beautiful 19 1/2" weakfish. We also caught at least 6 small fluke and had many bunker cut in half by bluefish.



On opening day for seabass, Bill Dabney joined me for a trip to the Garden State North reef. My new trolling motor performed flawlessly but you still have to find the wreck (coordinates aren't always 100%) and you have to get positioned over it. It's not that easy and I definitely need more practice!

We ended the day with 13 keepers, many throwbacks and even one fluke! As an added attraction, we saw a huge mola mola (ocean sunfish) alongside my boat.



Once again, Dave Spendiff joined me for a quick trip south to the sod banks near the Rutgers Research Center.

We anchored using my trolling motor and within minutes Dave had a keeper tog. Despite my 'encouragement' to dehook his fish inside the boat, the loud splash meant it would live to swim another day. After several shorts, I finally hooked my 16 1/2" keeper on a jig. We caught several more shorts until the hard incoming tide brought a lot of seaweed to end our fishing.



Bill Figley invited Bill Dabney, Ron Roshelli and Ed Valitutto for a seabass excursion on the AC reef.

With beautiful weather, the reef had a large number of boats fishing the larger structures. Therefore, we fished all the small structures like individual tanks, rolls of wire and a subway car. Each had a few keepers and we moved from one spot to another once the action slowed.

Our 40th fish preserved Bill's continuous record of limiting out! The photo shows 1/4 of our catch!







Dave Spendiff went fishing with son Garth and grandson Carson in Savannah, GA.
Both Garth and Dave had a Bay Slam on Saturday by catching a flounder, redfish & sea trout.

On Sunday, Garth's first cast with a killie below a cork hit the water and instantly disappeared. The rod was slowly raised but the line parted! As the tide went out, the catching became intense with 80 redfish and two small flounder boated. Absolutely insane fishing with 4 triple landings and 6 doubles.

On the way out, Garth spotted the cork from his first cast and grabbed it with the fish still hooked up!



Dave Spendiff joined me for a trip to the Garden State North reef. Unfortunately, it was shorts, shorts and more shorts! We probably caught over 80 short seabass overall. The last spot we tried was a small barge close to the edge of the reef. We quickly caught four keepers including a nice 16 1/2" keeper by Dave and a very nice triggerfish I caught.
