PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello VHFC Members,

Hi everyone,

This will be the last Newsletter for 2023! Wow, that seemed like a quick year. I hope you had an enjoyable and successful fishing season. As with everything in life, there are highs, lows and in betweens. Bluefish and weakfish were almost nonexistent, fluke were okay but you had to work for them, stripers were hard to find most days but other times were epic, bottom fishing for tog & seabass as well as bay fishing for white perch, blowfishing and crabs were generally very good. At least that's my assessment of this year but your results may have been vastly different.

The coming winter months offer a good opportunity to inspect all your fishing tackle. At a minimum, remove the reels from your rods so you can clean & lube the reel seats. Inspect your rods for damaged or worn guides and have them replaced for a few dollars or get yourself a new rod. Determine if the line on your reels needs replacing due to age, wear or loss of line. Braid

lasts a long time but it does eventually need replacing at least the first 30 yards or so. If you have the time and ability, service your reels or drop off one or two every few weeks at one of our local tackle shops. They will service them quickly once the holidays are done. Go through your tackle and rediscover all the items you bought over the years and rearrange their storage. Discard, repair or replace rusted hooks and lures. You will be amazed at what you can do with permanent marker pens, emery cloth, new trebles, deer hair, braid or dental floss and epoxy. Not your thing - then trash them and buy new. You deserve it but do not put it off until the next time you need to use your tackle!

Just a reminder, later this winter, on Saturday, February 10th, Southern Regional High School will hold their annual fishing flea market fundraiser. Held in the Southern Regional Middle School cafeteria, doors open at 8:00 AM and close at 2:00 PM. This is a great place to purchase some needed supplies at reasonable prices. VHFC will be there actively recruiting new members so stop by and say hello!

Lastly, have a wonderful holiday and come on out to the Community Center next Friday December 8th for our final club meeting for 2023. **This is our pizza meeting!** So come on out and enjoy a few slices while you swap fishing stories with fellow anglers. We do not schedule a speaker for our last meeting but for the third year in a row, Phil Simon will have a slide show of all our VHFC photos taken in 2023 from your fishing reports and our special events. Be sure to attend and provide your colorful comments for a fun final meeting for this year. BTW, Veterans Day will be celebrated on a Monday in 2024 so we will have our final meeting in November as normally scheduled.

ATLANTIC STATES MARINE FISHERIES COMMISSION WEBINAR - One Man's

Opinion - VHFC Board Member John Stuebing signed up for the webinar broadcast on November 15. The ASMFC presentation summarized specific recommendations on recreational fishing options regarding the 3 inch striped bass slot window. John's reaction to the meeting was as follows:

- 1. Meeting was well organized. Emilie Franke Fishery Management Plan Coordinator for Striped Bass - was prepared and answered questions with respect
- 2. About 85% of participants agree there is a problem with Striped Bass and agree to tighter regulations
- 3. In my opinion, the estimates on size of Biomass are based off both weak and dated information
- 4. In my opinion, the actual size of the Recreational Harvest (largest harvest take) is estimated and based on what is highly suspect data. Let's just call it poor data
- 5. No one really knows what the effect of forage loss, predator increase, degrading water quality and warming water is on Stripes Bass. In reality, the regulations may be affecting the smallest of problems
- 6. While this Agency can change the regulations, they really do not have the authority or ability to enforce the regulations

As presented, the change in regulations appears to be strictly "stop-gap". It should be part of a much bigger management approach. The ASMFC needs to get better data on a more timely basis. That data needs to include the environmental issues as well as the stock status and harvest rates. Improving the data from which decisions are made should be the priority and needs to be immediate. The decisions are affecting people's lives and businesses.

My experience tells me that "Decisions made with poor information always produce poor results".

Thanks John for taking the time to listen to the presentation and share your opinion with us.

NEW JERSEY JCAA & FISHING REGULATIONS by Phil Simon - New striped bass regulations are on the horizon as the ASMFC intends to take action in an attempt to restore our striper stocks by 2029. Though 2023 regulations are listed as an option, JCAA believes that there is no chance of the ASMFC keeping the status quo for 2024. At this point it's hard to tell whether the striped bass SSB (Spawning Stock Biomass) is recovering, or has at least stabilized. As I pointed out during the meeting the data through 2021 seems to indicate a slow trend in improvement. I suspect that the 2022 SSB numbers will show this trend is continuing. It may be an anomaly due to the growth of the 2015 class, or it may be a broader improvement in

stock status. We just don't have enough data yet. But the striped bass board is pressured to do something, so they chase the harvest numbers rather than the status of the stock. And in the case of the "emergency" reduction to a 3 inch slot, they re-adjusted their long term projections of stock rebuilding based on a single data point, the 2022 recreational harvest numbers. Remember, up through 2021 everything was on track to rebuild by 2029.

I am putting together a club position that captures what I think is the right approach for striped bass management and will send it out to everyone via separate email for your comments before I submit it to JCAA as our VHFC recommendation.

Atlantic Striped Bass Board Draft Addendum II Public Hearing Date Set for

December 5th - The in-person Striped Bass hearing will be held on December 5th, 6-8pm at the Stafford Township Municipal Building (260 East Bay Avenue, Manahawkin, NJ). JCAA hopes for a big turnout to let the ASMFC & New Jersey know of our displeasure with this Addendum. Stop by and hear for yourself what is happening to our Striped Bass regulations.

BOTTOM FISHING ON THE MARY M IV by Phil Simon- We are now scheduled with Capt Sam (Resigno) for a bottom fishing trip on Tuesday, May 21 2024, on the Mary M IV. The average cost per person should be about \$100 including tip. The only glitch is that we do not yet have the starting date for the black sea bass season, so I took a chance and scheduled it for a week after the 2023 start. We may have to reschedule if the season starts later but for now keep the date open for some great early season Seabass fishing..



The 62' Mary M IV is Barnegat Light's largest charter boat and has the speed and range to get you to the best fishing grounds on the Jersey Coast! She has a large heated cabin where you can stow your gear or eat your lunch.

The decks are fully walkaround and can accommodate up to 38 anglers on fishing trips.

ANNUAL LBI SURF FISHING CLASSIC - The 69th Annual Fall Surf Fishing Tournament kicked off on October 7 and will end in less than a week on December 10th. Full details at LBI Fall Classic. For all the latest daily weigh-ins and to see who has the largest fish to date, go to Live Weigh-In Results. With the new 3" Striped Bass slot requirement, the number of participants was down this year but as of today, 428 anglers have entered 149 fish:

As Jim Hutchinson Sr said in a recent article "A quick look at the striped bass weighed in the past two weeks for the Classic shows an increasing number of fish caught on artificial offerings. Notable is the number being beached on Avas and diamond jigs. This is not to say that bait is out as fish have also been chewing on bunker and clam baits. It appears that sand eels are showing up, and offerings that match the appearance and movement of the bait are catching fish."

Not a FOM entry but a once in a lifetime catch and a PB for Bill Figley. Bill said the Striper measured 55".

Bill and son Nate were fishing just south of BI and had a truly memorable day catching and releasing 9 jumbo bass.

I reviewed several charts and the best estimates for a 55" Striper are ~20 years old and weighing 56 to 80 Ibs. NOTE: Present world record is 81 Ibs 14 oz.

MONTHLY RECIPE - Roasted Fish with Cucumber Yogurt Sauce Submitted by Bill Dabney

This recipe originally called for cod but any thicker white filet like tog or striper should work, Be sure to remove any red meat before you cook.

Ingredients:

- 4 (6-8 oz) boneless, skinless filets (1/1/2 to 2 lbs total)
- 1 Bunch Scallions
- 3 TBSP EVOO plus more for drizzling
- 1 1/2 tsp Soy Sauce
- 1 tsp Fish Sauce
- 2/3 cup plain Greek Yogurt
- 2/3 cup Cucumber finely diced or shredded
- 1 TBSP fresh Dill or Mint finely chopped
- 2 tsp fresh Lemon juice
- 1 clove of Garlic mashed or grated
- Red Pepper flakes, Sea Salt & Black Pepper to taste

Directions:

- 1. Heat oven to 450. Finely chop scallion greens to equal 2 TBSP and put aside. Halve remaining scallions lengthwise to form ribbons. Place in a bowl with 1 TBSP oil and season with S&P.
- 2. Season fish with S&P and place on a baking sheet. Drizzle fish with a little oil, soy and fish sauce.
- 3. Place in the oven and bake for 2 minutes. Add scallion ribbons to the pan in a single layer. Bake 6 10 minutes longer until the fish is done to your liking.
- 4. While fish bakes, make the sauce. In a small bowl, mix together remaining 2 TBSP oil with 1 Tbsp minced scallion greens, yogurt, cucumber, dill or mint, lemon juice, garlic and S&P.
- 5. Arrange fish and scallions on a serving plate with lemon wedges and yogurt sauce. Garnish with remaining scallion greens and red pepper flakes. Enjoy!

There is no charge and no consequences if your boat doesn't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends. Personal pleasure craft, only.

A fire extinguisher is one of the items that is required. Last year, a new law regarding them went into effect. The extinguisher now has a 12 year qualifying life cycle. If you look at the bottom, you will see the year it was made. Just add 12 years to that date to figure the expiration date.
