PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello VHFC Members.

Summer is moving through at warp speed! Today is the 45th day of summer so we are more than halfway through with 7 weeks remaining until fall arrives and the temperature, crowds and traffic begin to diminish. Hopefully the continuous South winds also diminish for more than a few days so the water temperatures and fishing can heat up. Six weeks of southerly winds has resulted in chilly incoming churned up water causing big temperature swings to the warm bay waters. When you include all the weeds, greenheads numerous as ever and scarcity of keepers, bay fluking this year has been a real challenge. Ocean fishing has some advantages, but the cold water makes finding feeding fish difficult. But there are good catches being made. John Barrett had 8 keepers at the Tires on Barnegat Reef and Marty Friedrich had 8 keepers off the Red Tower in Beach Haven. You just have to put your time in before the season closes.

Just a reminder, Blackfish re-opened on 1 August for one fish at 15". So now you can catch and keep one Blackfish, one Sea Bass and one Weakfish for a real mixed bag fish fry - that's

pathetic! Go to NJ 2024 Seasons and Size Limits for all the details.

Fortunately two of our usual summertime dependable species have made an appearance. Both Kingfish and Triggerfish have been caught and submitted for FOM contention so they're around for the catching. Usually by now, the Blowfish are so annoying biting off Gulp tails that anglers feel compelled to go out and eliminate 50 or more of them. Unfortunately, that has not been the case yet but that will likely quickly change. Returning this year after several years absence are Croakers. Several members including me have caught them in Great Bay and the Middle Grounds while fluking. Larger ones are fine eating and smaller ones are fine bait.

There are still some stripers to be caught mostly near the inlet rocks or sod banks in the early/ late hours. Jerry Nichols was out on twice with his brother and nephew to the North jetty. His brother had a fat 33.5" Striper and his nephew landed a 20" fish. Even with a tag, getting a bass between 24 and 31 inches can be a challenge! And then there's Tuna! There are some around and they should stay around for several months. It's an investment in time to travel out to the Tuna grounds (weather permitting) and money for the gas, bait and equipment needed to land these fish, but if that's your thing, go for it! So far, Tim Naples is the only club member reporting a catch. Tim had 3 Yellowfin back in July.

Finally, I look forward to seeing everyone at our next meeting on August 9th. Once again, **meetings start at 7:15!** As always, be sure to take a photo of your catch for our awards and submit a report for others to enjoy and learn where the fish are biting.

NEW JERSEY FISHING REGULATIONS by Phil Simon - Not much to report regarding regulations and related activities. All of the various councils, commissions and committees are busy gathering data for the Fall/Winter rule setting season. Right now I don't see much indication of major changes going from 2024 to 2025, other than Black Sea Bass, which may be headed to yet another cutback in allowable catch. (I know, it makes no sense at all.) I also attended a meeting of the Mid Atlantic Science and Statistical Committee, and these folks (mostly senior fishery academic and government scientists) seem to be concerned about the MRIP as much as we are. We are still expecting the current follow up studies to deliver results in early 2025, but I am going to press for an interim report.

You may be wondering what happened to the fluke so far this year. The conventional wisdom is that the strong southerly winds that have been hitting us since the Spring have resulted in an upwelling of the cold water that sits off the coast, which turns off the bite. (For a brief explanation of this phenomenon, take a look at this brief article: Upwelling and Its Coastal Effects). The cold ocean water lowered the temperature in the back bays as well, and was also responsible for the heavy fog we encountered a few weeks ago as well. See Thick Fog Hovers Over the Jersey Shore for further info. There have also been suggestions that the weakening Gulf Stream currents have allowed the cold Labrador current to move more cold water along the coast. An interesting idea although there is not much data yet. Another factor may be the heavy fresh water runoff from the Spring rains, which lowered the salinity of the bays and inshore grounds. Fluke are not happy when the salt levels get low. These are all good possibilities, and they may all be true. But there is another possibility, one that was raised at a recent meeting of the Summer Founder, Scup, and Black Sea Bass Advisory Panel meeting which I attended a few weeks ago.

During the Fall and Winter, Summer Flounder move away from our waters and to the north and east 50 or more miles off Long Island and Massachusetts. This is the area and time where the heaviest commercial harvest of Summer Flounder (and Black Sea Bass) takes place. So it's entirely possible that the NJ fluke population is being selectively harvested by the trawlers. This nightmare scenario still lacks data, especially the details of the migration patterns of the fish that spend their Spring and Summers in NJ waters, but tagging studies are now ongoing specifically on this matter. The advisory panel listed research on this matter as a high priority. Let's hope we figure this out before the NJ fluke fishery goes the way of winter flounder and weakfish.



Go to <u>VHFC Contest Rules</u> for full FOM entry details. Simply take a photo showing the length of fish atop a rigid ruler. For Striped Bass, pinch the tail. All fish must be in season and legal size except for the FOM for "Over Slot" Stripers which should be quickly measured and released. Bluefish must be 14" minimum. Please send your photos to both Weighmaster Pat Presutto and Ed Valitutto. Pat determines the length but we both keep track of the entries. SAUTEED SKATE WINGS by Ed Valitutto - This is a recipe I saw on **Surf Fishing LBI with Bayside Dave** submitted by Tom Griffiths. It looked really interesting and Tom was happy to let me share it. Here's Tom's article.... Chefs I know enjoy eating sauteed skate wings with brown butter! I was taught to poach skate wings while learning to cook in NYC restaurants, then peel off the skin & serve with black butter & capers. It's absolutely delicious... I've noticed skate on restaurant menus and in fish stores more and more lately. I was fishing at the Jersey shore recently & caught some skate, dogfish, fluke and spot. (all very small) but the skate was a keeper!





Skate wings with Capers

Serves 2

Four Skate wings, skin on - See Ed's note at the end of the recipe

- 4 oz Butter, softened
- 2 Tbsp Capers

Small handful of slivered almonds (Optional)

- 1 qt Water for poaching the wings
- 2 Bay leaves
- 4 Lemon, slices
- 4 Tbsp Apple Cider Vinegar
- 1 Tbsp Kosher Salt
- 10 ea Black Peppercorns
- 1. Heat the water, bay leaves, lemon, vinegar, salt and pepper to 160 F for 5 minutes; carefully place the skate wings into the pan to poach, submerged, for 15 minutes. The water will come down in temperature when you put the skate into it; keep the water at 160 F so it poaches gently.

- 2. Carefully drain the poaching liquid out and let the skate cool to the touch-you can easily peel the top skin off of the skate wings once it is warm; reverse and repeat. Discard the skin. Place the poached skate wing onto a plate and keep warm.
- 3. Although the skate is delicate, there is cartilage in the center which will hold it together. Basically, the skate 'meat' is on the top and bottom of the cartilage.
- 4. Towards the end of the poaching time, heat the butter in a pan until light brown; you'll smell toasted nuts... this is brown butter. You can serve the brown butter or cook a little longer & create black butter which is very popular with skate wings. Turn off the heat and add the capers and almonds if using, this will stop the butter from cooking any longer and bubble up.
- 5. Pour over the skate and enjoy-simply use a fork or spoon to slide the tender flesh from the center cartilage.

Ed V's note: DO NOT CUT OFF THE WINGS AND DISCARD THE SKATE TO SLOWLY DIE! The two accepted ways to dispatch skate are 1) Blunt force trauma by a blow to the head in the area between the eyes or 2) Insert a knife between the eyes and cut back toward the spine. Both methods are quick and humane. Then, cut off the wings and ice them.

I also promise to keep and clean a skate and try this recipe. I will provide my honest assessment. I hoped to catch a suitable specimen during the tri-club fishing but between the four of us on John Stuebing's boat, we only caught one paltry skate!



VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS By Jeff Orsoe - Both the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and the United States Power Squadrons have certified vessel examiners who will perform a free Vessel Safety Check ("VSC") at your boat, at a time of mutual convenience. There is no charge and no consequences if your boat doesn't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends. Personal pleasure craft, only.

I am available to perform a Vessel Safety exam on your vessel any time after May 8th and have the VE stickers (Vessel Exam decal) that is placed on the vessel upon successful completion of the checklist. As stated above, there is no charge for the exam and if you do not qualify for the sticker, the results will not be reported to any agency. The boat owner just needs to take care of the problem and reschedule another exam for the decal to be awarded. **Contact: Jeff Orsoe Cell / Text: 732-672-5530 or email: jorsoe786@gmail.com**.

A fire extinguisher is required onboard and all fire extinguishers now have a 12 year qualifying life cycle. If you look at the bottom, you will see the year it was made. Just add 12 years to that date to figure the expiration date. Also, NJ law now requires a PFD be worn by all occupants if your vessel is less than 26 feet while underway between Nov 1 and May 1.
