PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello VHFC Members,

Well we are now officially into the fall season! The good news is that the relentless water-chilling south winds have finally abated and allowed for a long awaited spurt of decent Fluke fishing. The bad news is that the spurt didn't last long enough as easterly winds arrived and shut down the last 10 days of fluking until 2025! Unfortunately, those east winds have stayed and produced significant wave heights to keep most boats dockside through the start of the October 1 Sea Bass opening. This past weekend seas have started to lie down but there is still a decent swell around especially offshore. Early today, wave heights were 3.6 ft. and the forecast was 3 - 5 ft until midweek when wave heights drop to ~3 '. Right now, they are 4.9'.

I still have a few peanut bunker swirling in my lagoon but their numbers are definitely dwindling as they start their migration south. While fishing off the bulkhead near the condos in Barnegat Light with John Stubing on Friday, massive schools of bunker were streaming by us as they made their way to the inlet. In fact, while reeling a very small Tog, John felt a very strong tug

and his fish was gone. My guess is a Striper caught his lunch. And more will be arriving but you have to be ready with all equipment - rods, reels & tackle all set. If you remember past years, things can explode fishing-wise with little advance notice. Hopefully we will soon get into the normal westerly winds that dominate our fall weather and allow us to venture out and fish before the severe winter weather arrives - it's only 13 1/2 weeks from today until 2025! And it will speed by with all the holidays, family gatherings, kids / grandkids sporting events, etc. that happen this time of year.

Finally, I look forward to seeing everyone at our next meeting on October 11th. Once again, **meetings start at 7:15!** As always, be sure to take a photo of your catch for our awards and submit a report for others to enjoy and learn where the fish are biting.

NEW JERSEY FISHING REGULATIONS by Phil Simon - Things are very quiet right now on the regulatory front. The ASMFC is getting ready for its annual meeting, so we can expect some news for November. The meeting will be held Oct 21 – 24 in Annapolis Maryland, and can be viewed online ([ASMFC 2024 Annual Meeting Registry](#) Webinar ID: 565-353-915). Of interest to us would be the recent actions regarding menhaden management in Chesapeake Bay. Enough people have been raising a stink in the last year about Omega Protein's harvest of menhaden in the bay that the organization is now trying to make some moves and the politics have become intense. Omega tries to deflect the complaints with spin and press releases, but the locals can see what is happening to the striper populations when there is much reduced forage in the bay.

Other recent activities have focused on lobster and cobia regulations. Similarly, the MAMFC will be having a meeting this week, but nothing on the agenda of major concern or impact on recreational fishing. Specifications for Atlantic Mackerel, Butterfish, Spiny Dogfish, and Tilefish are on the agenda. Keep in mind that once these organizations set the overall catch limits for each species, along with general guidelines for size and bag limits, it will be up to each state commission to set the final seasons, bag and size limits. The meetings over the winter of the NJ Marine Fisheries Council will be the ones that need our attention. Let me know if there are any questions. I will try my best to get answers.

All fish must be in season and legal size except for the FOM for "Over Slot" Stripers which should be quickly measured and released. Bluefish must be 14" minimum. **Please send your photos to both Weighmaster Pat Presutto and Ed Valitutto. Pat determines the length but we both keep track of the entries. AUGUST RECIPE TESTED AS PROMISED by Ed Valitutto - The August Newsletter had a Skate recipe that I promised to try as soon as I caught one suitable for the table. Well that finally happened. The instructions called for the Skate to be gently poached at 160°F for 20 minutes in an aromatic broth. This step cooked the Skate and allowed the skin to be easily removed. A brown butter sauce with lemons and capers was served over the fish.



This is the Skate after poaching and removing the skin which easily came off using a tablespoon. The hardest part was maintaining the water at a low temperature - barely a simmer. There is a piece of cartilage that separates the two halves and can be easily removed which I did.



This is the finished dish and was very enjoyable with a nice glass of white wine. The fish was very mild flavored and delicate. I suggested adding slivered almonds to the brown butter sauce but I would change that to thinly sliced almonds or just omit them. Give it a try!

Broiled Bluefish with Lime Aioli by Ed Valitutto - I was sent this recipe from one of the many cooking sites I have. It's easy and should also work well on other fish like Striper or Tog.

Broiled Bluefish with Lime Aioli



Ingredients

- 2 medium garlic cloves
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 yolk from a large egg
- 2 teaspoons fresh juice from 1 lime, plus wedges for serving
- 1/4 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon chipotle chile powder
- 1/4 cup canola or vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/8 teaspoon lime zest from 1 lime
- 1 1/2 pounds bluefish fillets, cut into 4 even portions

1 tablespoon chopped flat-leaf parsley

Directions

- 1) Preheat the oven to 400°F and arrange the rack 8 inches from the element. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil or parchment paper.
- 2) Combine garlic with a pinch of salt and work into a paste. In a medium bowl, whisk together garlic paste, lime zest, egg yolk, lime juice, mustard, and chili powder. Whisking constantly, drizzle in canola and extra-virgin olive oils to form a thick, emulsified sauce (Aioli). Season aioli with salt and pepper. Or you can use a blender, Blend garlic with egg yolk, lime juice, mustard, and chile powder; then drizzle in canola oil in a thin, steady stream until a thick, emulsified sauce forms. Whisk in olive oil (do not add olive oil to the blender) and season with salt and pepper.
- 3) Pat fish dry with paper towels, arrange on a baking sheet and spread the aioli evenly over it. Bake until fish reaches 135°F on an instant-read thermometer, about 7 minutes. Remove from the oven and turn on the broiler.
- 4) Broil bluefish until lightly browned and bubbling on top and an instant-read thermometer registers 140°F when inserted in the center ~4 minutes. Transfer bluefish to plates, sprinkle with parsley, and serve with lime wedges.

We caught three respectable keepers, many shorts, birds and skates. Andy's and the fuel docks, but all we caught were shorts. Still a great day on the water!



Mike Woodrow, Doug O'Brien and Jim Healy were out for some fishing around the inlet and BI reef. On the way out, blitzing 2 - 3 lb bluefish provided about 2 hours of fun mostly on top water plugs including the two shown on one plug!

Out on the reef they caught sea bass, robins, skates and 3 keeper fluke. They tried tog along the fuel dock but had all shorts. Still a great day on the water!

VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS By Jeff Orsoe - Both the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and the United States Power Squadrons have certified vessel examiners who will perform a free Vessel Safety Check ("VSC") at your boat, at a time of mutual convenience. There is no charge and no consequences if your boat doesn't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends. Personal pleasure craft, only.

I am available to perform a Vessel Safety exam on your vessel any time and have the VE stickers (Vessel Exam decal) that is placed on the vessel upon successful completion of the checklist. There is no charge for the exam. The boat owner just needs to take care of the problem and reschedule another exam for the decal to be awarded. Although it's late in the season, it can be nice to know what needs replacing for the rest of this season and next year.

A fire extinguisher is required onboard and all fire extinguishers now have a 12 year qualifying life cycle. If you look at the bottom, you will see the year it was made. Just add 12 years to that date to figure the expiration date. Also, NJ law now requires a PFD be worn by all occupants if your vessel is less than 26 feet while underway between Nov 1 and May 1.
