But lest we get ahead of ourselves, there are some fish still around - Striped Bass and Blackfish especially - with Sea Bass and Tuna further offshore. We still have 9 FOMs open until 31 December so don't put your fishing gear away just yet. Either from the sand or local party boat - if your boat is already sitting wrapped on blocks in your driveway - the fish are still here for the next few weeks. Pick a good weather day, bundle up and go get 'em.

As far as the fishing for 2024, I personally would give it a generous B. Of course, there were some fantastic days on the water but there were also some pretty tough ones. Let's look at most of our available species:

Striped Bass - Spring was decent but the late fall was awesome by boat. None entered yet from the sand!

Bluefish - Catches were few and far between except for the inlet. Most were on the small side.

Tog - Excellent spring and fall despite the horrendous poaching going on at the inlets.

Fluke - Fish were here but near non-stop south winds kept the water temperature way down and made catching difficult until late season.

Sea Bass - Overall numbers and size seemed to be down. You had to really work for them.

Weakfish - The 'Unicorns of the Sea' lived up to their elusive reputation.

Tuna - Especially good and in close with several club members boating one.

Blowfish, Kingfish & White Perch - All three seemed to be lacking this year.

Skates, Rays & Doggies - Plenty to go around for everyone!

That's the way I saw 2024 at least in our local area. If you had much better results, then more power to you! The important thing is to get out there and enjoy yourself with family and friends. Stay safe over the winter and we will do it all over again next year. Our next meeting will be at the Community Center on **Friday April 11th**, **2025!**

REGULATORY NEWS FOR DECEMBER 2024 by Phil Simon - Most of the key decisions from the ASMFC and MAMFC that are pending should be completed in the next couple of weeks. We are all interested in what is going to happen to the Striped Bass regulations, as next season's regs and season dates are still on the table. Did any of you listen in on the informational web conference on Dec 4? The issue seems to be that the Atlantic Striped Bass Management Board got data from its technical committee (TC) that based on their computer projections, the stock has a less than 50% chance of being rebuilt by 2029, a number and date currently set by existing directives from the management board. However, the TC also showed that with only a very small change in the data input for how many fish would be harvested in 2024, we would move to a trajectory that is above 50%. In fact, the two curves are so similar as to be statistically indistinguishable, a fact that I pointed out during the Q&A portion of the webinar, and to which the head of the TC agreed. My sense is that the data is too weak for the board to take any action at this time. If I'm wrong, then they will most likely impose some type of seasonal closure, an action in my view is like getting a speeding ticket for going 66 in a 65 zone, with the penalty being loss of your license for 2 months. The board will meet on December 16 to decide. You can register for the webinar to listen in and make a comment if you like at ASBMB Registration

The other major pending decision regards Black Sea Bass, which if you have read my last couple of newsletter articles, could be subject to a 10 to 20% cut for 2025 in spite of the fact that the stock is way over its target size. However, unless there is some legal issue hovering in the

hallways, I believe that we will not see a cut, as basically no one on the MAMFC, ASMFC or NOAH thinks this is the proper thing to do, and the NOAH head for our region provided an apparent legal out for this move. This will be decided on Tuesday December 10 at the meeting of the mid Atlantic commission, and you can find a link to join this meeting as well as full documentation on the commissions web page at December 2024 Council Meeting. Be forewarned that the briefing book for this meeting is over 300 pages, but the info for the Black Sea Bass decision is the first major set of documents after the overview of all the stocks. Black Sea Bass starts at page 60. But the key recommendation from the MAMFC staff, who guide the discussion, is this: "Given that the 2024 Management Track Assessment was not used to update the RHL, a status quo RHL is expected, recreational harvest has been declining in recent years, and given the current positive stock status (i.e., biomass more than double the target level and overfishing not occurring), Council staff recommend that recreational black sea bass measures remain unchanged in 2025. This would result in virtually unchanged measures across 2023-2025." Page 72.

If all goes smoothly, the Black Sea Bass recreational harvest limit, as well as those for summer flounder and scup, will remain unchanged from 2024.

DUES CHANGE FOR 2025 by Ed Valitutto - If you weren't at the last meeting, let me 'just rip off the band aid' and say that the board unanimously agreed that our club dues be increased from **\$40 to \$50** for adults and that Junior members remain at **\$10**. Our dues have remained the same for 10+ years! Everyone knows that prices have increased over that time. But VHFC has expanded many of the club benefits for our members and we want to do even more moving forward! For example, just look at the differences between 2014 and 2024.

All fish must be in season and legal size except for the FOM for "Over Slot" Stripers which should be quickly measured and released. Bluefish must be 14" minimum. Lemon Herb Baked Striped Bass by Ed Valitutto - I found this recipe originally published in the October 2018 edition of *The Fisherman* magazine. I have not made it yet but I definitely will try it as part of my Christmas dinner. I will use Striper that has been vacuum sealed and frozen but I am sure this would be delicious using Tog, Cod, Haddock or any firm white fleshed fish. Note: cooking times vary based on thickness and temperature. **Do not overcook!**



Ingredients:

~ 3 lbs striped bass fillet cut to equal thickness and set out for 30 minutes 2 tbsp. melted butter 1 lemon Salt and pepper

Topping:

3/4 cup Panko bread crumbs
3 cloves garlic minced
2 tbsp. fresh parsley minced
1 tbsp. dill minced
Zest from 1 lemon
2 tbsp. shredded parmesan cheese
3 tbsp. melted butter

Instructions:

- 1) Preheat the oven to 400 degrees.
- 2) Combine Topping ingredients in a small bowl.
- 3) Line a pan with foil and spray with cooking spray or brush with olive oi.
- 4) Place fish in the pan and brush with melted butter. Season with salt and pepper, and squeeze some lemon over it.
- 5) Sprinkle crumb mixture on top and bake uncovered for 13 to 17 minutes or until fish flakes easily with a fork.
- 6) Enjoy with a nice glass of white wine!

VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS By Jeff Orsoe - No longer available this year, but I will be available to perform a Vessel Safety exam on your vessel any time next spring and have the VE sticker (Vessel Exam decal) placed on the vessel upon successful completion of the checklist. There is no charge for the exam. The boat owner just needs to take care of the problem and reschedule another exam for the decal to be awarded. Schedule your inspection early so you know what needs replacing at the start of next season. **Contact: Jeff Orsoe Cell / Text: 732-672-5530 or email: jorsoe786@gmail.com**.

Note: a fire extinguisher is required onboard and all fire extinguishers now have a 12 year qualifying life cycle. If you look at the bottom, you will see the year it was made. Just add 12 years to that date to figure the expiration date. Also, NJ law now requires a PFD be worn by all occupants if your vessel is less than 26 feet while underway between Nov 1 and May 1.
