PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello VHFC Members.

With the arrival of Spring on March 20th, winter is now behind us and the start of the 2025 season is here with our first Newsletter! And what a season it's shaping up to be with even more club improvements again this year. I have an article later in the Newsletter highlighting all the new features in more detail.

Hopefully you've already begun getting your boat and fishing tackle ready or better yet, have been out using them. Bring your equipment to our local Bait & Tackle sponsors, not only to say 'thank you' for all their help in our club events, but also to get your club discount! Do it before the rush of the Memorial Day weekend (May 24 - 26) arrives. Don't expect your gear to be at its peak after spending many months lying around the house, basement or garage. At a minimum, remove your reels from your rods, wipe them down to remove any accumulated salts or grime, check your guides, remove several feet of braid or replace any older mono and lube your reels as recommended. For spinning reels, remove the spool and clean the inside of the spool and the

reel shaft. Add some reel lube or petroleum jelly and you should be good to go. **Remember, tighten every screw and nut securely**. Otherwise, bring them in for service **now**! Go through your tackle and discard anything not worth repairing or that you haven't used in years!

Finally, get out there and fish! White Perch and Striped Bass are definitely here. Bayside Dave had a string of Perch and a short Striper from the Mullica back on March 7th, Alan Goracy had a keeper Bass on March 11th at Gravelling Point and new member Glen Minor had some nice Perch there two days later. So it has definitely started! And they all forgot to enter their fish into our FOM contests that opened 1 March! But our Weighmaster Pat Presutto got a Striper just shy of 31" on bloods that he entered for our first 2025 entry! Earlier this week Al Goracy fished Gravelling point and had 6 bass with one keeper! White Perch are also making an appearance with Bill Bond catching one at 12 1/2 and Dave Spendiff getting one at 13". Hopefully the weather cooperates to really kick the spring fishing into high gear. From Tony's B&T April 6th Report "Striped bass action is very good in proximity to Causeway bridges. Bloodworms are the bait of choice for bait anglers & white or pearl paddle tails on the artificial scene. Tautog bite is slow off the south jetty in Barnegat Light, but I have spoken to a couple anglers that were able to hook a keeper. White perch bite is picking up in Beach Haven West lagoons on grass shrimp, minnows and/or bloodworms.

I look forward to seeing everyone on April 11th at our first meeting for 2025. Once again, meetings start at 7:15 but doors are open at 6:45. As always, be sure to take a photo of your catch for our awards and submit a report for others to enjoy and learn where the fish are.

NOTE: I am on vacation Apr 24 - May 7 with only email service. Also, the May NL will be out one week later than usual on May 11.

NEW JERSEY REGULATORY NEWS by Phil Simon - Sector Separation: I was against it but now I am for it.

The Mid Atlantic Marine Fishery Council has been soliciting input on the proposal (in the form of a formal amendment) to divide the regulations concerning recreational fishing into one group for party and charter captains, and the other for the rest of us. My initial reaction, which I expressed

at one of the open meetings run by the Council, was in opposition to the idea. Here were my reasons:

- 1. This is a zero-sum game with winners and losers, and the losers in this case are recreational boat and surf fishermen, the winners are the charter captains and party boats.
- 2. Private recreational fishermen will likely face a loss of fishing days or reduced keepers or both, as the recreational RHL will now have to be allocated to two separate groups.
- This introduces yet another "us vs them" factor into the discussions on fishing regulations, adding to the already uncomfortable animosity between the commercial and recreational sectors.
- 4. This would add another layer of complexity to the regulation setting process as well as the set of regulations the recreational community will have to deal with.
- 5. At least for New Jersey, this would primarily impact fishing for Summer Flounder, which is already tight. Scup fishing is not a major fishery in NJ, and bluefish are already subject to sector separation under current regulations. And as Black Sea Bass are quite plentiful currently, the allocations probably would not be too impactful, although some changes are likely here as well. So, the battles will be primarily over Summer Flounder and would be highly contentious. Loss of catch in this fishery will have a big impact on the bait and tackle shops, and other business dependent on Summer Flounder private boat and surf fishing, as this is the primary summer fishery in NJ.
- 6. A significant problem with the amendment as written is that it is hard to judge just what the magnitude and scope of potential changes to RHL allocation are under consideration. Without the specific numbers that could result makes it difficult to support the overall proposal. Hopefully the next version will give us a clear indication of just how much the private sector will be impacted.

But, I also heard what sounded like a cry for help from the charter and party boat captains at the meeting, and I started to think about the other side of the question. So here are my reasons to support the initiative:

- The charter and party boat businesses have been in decline for a number of years, due to the changing demographics of the recreational fishing sector, the increased costs of fuel and crew, and the loss of target species due to a combination of climate factors, environmental decay, and regulatory mismanagement. Help for this sector is needed now.
- 2. For many recreational fishermen, charter and party boats provide their only access to open water fishing (bay and ocean). The ongoing loss of these businesses that we have witnessed over the last 20 years has reduced fishing opportunities for many people. Several members of our fishing club use charters exclusively, signing up for dozens of trips each season.

- 3. For me personally, even though I have my own boat, I still go out on 3 to 4 charter trips each season, as I know these captains can find the fish when I can't. It's also nice to have someone else responsible for the boat, the cleanup, and the filleting. Yes, it probably costs me more, but the cost/benefit ratio for me is favorable.
- 4. Our fishing club brings in guest speakers at each monthly meeting from April to October, and many of these speakers are local charter fisherman who are willing to share their techniques and best practices in exchange for exposure to our club membership and the potential to attract new customers. This is a valuable source of fishing knowledge for us and serves to increase the overall knowledge and enthusiasm of our club members.
- 5. For some of us, party boats provide an opportunity to get out fishing when conditions are a little too sporty for small boats, or when the distance to the best fishing grounds is farther then we would like to go in a small one-motor boat. Party boats and large charter boats provide the opportunity for larger groups of families and friends to fish together. Our fishing club now organizes three large charters per season, ranging from 10 to 25 members fishing together. Our choice of boats has diminished steadily as the economics of the business model and the restricted harvest limits have reduced both the profitability of the boats and the size of the customer base as the opportunities to bring home a fish have diminished.

Weighing the pros and cons concerning this issue, my reaction is to support sector separation, at least for now, because I think we need to take care to save the Charter/Party sector from going totally out of existence. Allowing their customers a greater chance to take home a fish should help to support the commercial viability of the sector. But care would be needed to avoid damage to the private sector. Reduced opportunities to fish will impact the businesses that they support, including bait and tackle shops, marinas, boat dealers, fishing publications, and more. And as they say, the devil is in the details, which we cannot see yet.

Next steps, the Council staff will re-work the amendment taking all the comments into consideration, hopefully adding some details about just what the regs could look like, and the process will continue with another round of public meetings. **What do you think?**

2025 VHFC CHANGES AND RECAP OF CLUB BENEFITS by Ed Valitutto

- 1. Doors Open Earlier Last year we started the club meetings at 7:15 and will continue but doors will be opened at 6:45 for 2025. The earlier time will allow members to pay their dues, buy raffle tickets, 50 / 50 tickets & hats, look at our library books, grab a drink or just talk to fellow anglers.
- 2. Pizza Nights! Last year, we added two additional pizza nights. 2025 pizza nights are scheduled for the May meeting, for our July meeting and for our final yearly November meeting.
- 3. Club Member Rewards For New Member Sign Ups Continues! Starting last year, a \$20 gift certificate was given to club members for each new adult member they recruited to join VHFC. So get your friends and neighbors to join our club and earn yourself rewards.
- 4. Melanie Boytos Award (MBA) In 2024 we added Blackfish making the eligible species for MBA the same as our 6 FOY species. Thus, the angler with the highest point total for any or all species will have their name engraved on a special trophy displayed at a local Bait & Tackle store or elsewhere per their request. For 2025, we modified the table used to determine the points awarded for your largest catch per species. VHFC will also provide the monthly leading contenders on both our website and Newsletter. See VHFC Contest Rules for full rules and the Point table.
- **5. Fish of the Year (FOY)** No changes to a great contest for the anglers who land the largest of six species Weakfish, Striped Bass, Bluefish, Fluke, Sea Bass & Blackfish. Each winning angler receives a lovely engraved personal plaque.
- 6. Increased Junior Angler Awards Last year, per Bill Figley's suggestion, VHFC increased the Junior Angler awards to \$50 each for five species! For 2025, we have added two new species Striped Bass and Sea Bass for seven awards. Note: if a Junior Angler wins an adult contest, they may enter a second fish for a junior award. Junior Anglers are members who have not reached their 18th birthday by the May meeting and cost only \$10. So sign up your kids and grandkids now for some fun competitions.
- 7. Increased Adult FOM (Fish of the Month) Awards Last year we had 29 awards. In 2025, we eliminated Red Drum and added 6 new awards for a total of 34. We added Striped Bass over the 31" slot size caught from the surf (Tyler Leary's suggestion), we added a separate Spring Blackfish caught from land and we added 4 Pelagic species awards Yellowfin Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Mahi Mahi and False Albacore. Most award certificates will continue to be from FHQ, but we are also planning on having some awards available to our other sponsors. Full details of all 34 adult contests appear later or can viewed at 2025 FOM Standings
- 8. Great Club Events for Members and Their Families:

- a. Three Party Boat Trips Two Bottom Trips on Mary M IV on May 21 & October 8 and a Fluke Trip on Super Chic on August 19. VHFC will provide coffee and donuts to start off your morning.
- b. **Battle on the Beach** VHFC volunteers judge this fishing competition between several local high schools on the Barnegat Light sands. Winning school gets bragging rights, year long trophy display and a \$1,000 scholarship donated by the LBI Surf Fishing Committee. No date yet but stay tuned. This is a fun event watching these great kids compete.
- c. **Fluke Tournament & BBQ on July 12** Great day on the water and fantastic free BBQ for contest members and families held at the Mill Creek Park.
- d. **Tri Club Fluke Challenge** Initiated in 2024, the tournament is Saturday July 26 with the BBQ on Sunday at the Forked River Tuna Club. This is a tournament between Village Harbour, Fish Hawks and Forked River Tuna Club. VHFC will host the BBQ for 2025.
- e. **Club Dinner** Fall fun at Kostas Grill in Tuckerton. This is a nice gathering off the water with members and their families to enjoy a lovely dinner made even better with wine and appetizers provided by VHFC!
- f. **Two New Tournaments for 2025** VHFC Inshore Slam May 12 18 and VHFC Open in late August. These events allow club members to compete for prizes while enjoying some great fishing. Brainchild of John Stuebing, more details will be given at our April meeting and later in the Newsletter.

NEW JERSEY SALTWATER RECREATIONAL REGISTRY - Individual saltwater anglers ages 16 and older MUST register with the State of New Jersey. Registrations expired on 31 December. So if you are now age 16+ or you have not yet renewed your registration for 2025, go to **NJ Fish & Wildlife Electronic License System** and complete the appropriate form. Registration / **renewal is free and is required if you fish NJ waters**. Also, your registration number is needed if you plan to apply for a Striped Bass Bonus Tag. BOTTOM FISHING ON THE MARY M IV by Phil Simon- We are now scheduled with Capt Sam (Rescigno) for a bottom fishing trip on Tuesday, May 21 2024, on the Mary M IV. The average cost per person should be about \$100 including tip depending on the total number of anglers. I took a chance and scheduled it for a week after the 2023 start and luckily, the 2024 opening

dates will be the same as last year - 10 fish at 12.5 inches May 17 - June 19. So we will be hitting the wrecks just days after opening. Keep the date open and sign up for some great early season bottom fishing. VHFC will provide coffee and donuts for your enjoyment.



This is a full size party boat with plenty of space. Captain Sam and first mate Sammy provide a great day on the water.

The 62' Mary M IV is Barnegat Light's largest charter boat and has the speed and range to get you to the best fishing grounds on the Jersey Coast! She has a large heated cabin where you can stow your gear or eat your lunch. The decks are fully walkaround and can accommodate up to 38 anglers on fishing trips.

VHFC INSHORE SLAM by John Stuebing - We have a new tournament scheduled for May 12th to the 18th. We will be fishing for Fluke, Bluefish, Weakfish and Striper for an entire week (7 days). Every angler can fish any two days of their choosing. The rules give every type of angler some advantages and some disadvantages. Full rules explanation at our meeting!

- Boat Anglers can only fish in the Bay. They cannot enter or fish in any inlet. This gives Kayakers even chances with other boats.
- Surf Fishermen can fish from shore, piers, bulkheads or jetties. If fishing from the jetty, they cannot go out on the jetty further than the shore line. They can fish the Ocean (from the beach) and part of the Inlet. They lack the mobility of the Boat Fisherman.

All fish will be weighed in at designated Weigh-In Stations. All NJ fishing regulations apply. Anglers earn points for most weight by species. Winners are determined by total points earned across all species. Entry Fee will be \$20 with all fees returned as prizes. Top three anglers will win a percentage of the pot. Below is a look at how points are earned.

Total Weight is the cumulative catch per species over two days. Therefore, each angler can enter 2 Striper, 6 Fluke, 6 Bluefish and 2 Weakfish for the tournament.

2025 FISHING CONTESTS - VHFC has three yearly fishing contests: Melanie Boytos Award (MBA), Fish of the Year (FOY) and Fish of the Month (FOM). Full rules and details are on our website at <u>VHFC Contest Rules</u> and standings to date are at <u>VHFC Standings</u>.

New for 2025 – All fish must be caught south of 40* 06' (Manasquan Inlet) and north of 39* 05' (Townsend Inlet). This applies to both Boat and Surf fishing. Head boats leaving from both Pt Pleasant and Brielle are legal. Tuna can be entered from the Hudson Canyon to Wilmington Canyon.

Take a picture showing the entire fish with the measuring device, preferably a hard ruler, visible. Mail or text your photo to Weighmaster Pat Presutto (pat1016pat@aol.com or 609 994 8361) with a copy to Ed Valitutto (edvalitutto@gmail.com or 609 994 1311). All fish must be IAW NJ F&W size limits and in season. Bluefish must be 14" minimum and bonus stripers must have the tag visible to enter.

FOM RULES REVIEW by Ed Valitutto - All FOM entries are made by taking a photo of your fish against a ruler showing the tip of the fish down through its tail. This method allows anglers to enter a fish and release it if desired. Use a rigid ruler widely available, not a measuring tape which stretches with use. Send your photos to Weighmaster Pat Presutto via text (preferred) at **609 994 8361** or email him at **pat1016pat@aol.com**. Please copy me on your entry, Ed Valitutto via text at **609 994 1311** or email me at **edvalitutto@gmail.com**. Pat will determine the official length and it will appear on our website and in future Newsletters. Ties split the award.

VHFC measures **Striped Bass** per NJ F&W rules "Total length (TL) is the distance from the tip of the snout with the mouth closed to the tip of the longer lobe of the caudal fin (tail), measured with the lobes compressed along the midline (tail squeezed). All other fish, except Kingfish, are measured to the center of the tail (**Fluke, Weakfish, Sea Bass, Blowfish, & Tog**) or fork (**Bluefish & White Perch**). **Kingfish** are measured to the bottom sloping tail lobe. See photo:



Since Kingfish have a sloping tail, length is based on the bottom tail lobe. This was Gene Geld's 2021 winning 16" beauty!



Here's a Weakfish caught by yours truly. This was 17 1/2" and won nothing!

Perfect Tube as the best trolling lure for Bass. John listed the Pros as phenomenal productivity and the ability to troll in as little as 5 feet of water. His only con was that it gets bit by interference fish such as Blues and Sea Bass. The Key features include: 16', 19', and 24" lengths in black, wine, and bubblegum colors with a Mustad Hoodlum Stinger Hook.

John claims these lures get big stripers to hit any time of the day by shallow trolling or fishing deeper with the aid of egg or drail weights. John likes to troll them slowly at ~2 kts. Give it a try and report out at an upcoming meeting.

A WORD ABOUT SAFETY by Jeff Orsoe - I'm sure that many of us are having thoughts and dreams of the approaching season with plans and goals for catching fish. This is also the time that all of us are either readying our boats for the season or already in the water and wetting those lines. As we write down all the items we need to do, such as preparing the power system(s) whether we contact our mechanic, or you are a DIY person, those chores include bottom preparation, checking our electronics that they are operating as intended. Whatever it is, we need to get it done to be on the water ASAP.

But have you considered the other side of chores to be checked? I'm speaking of the safety items that are stored aboard. Several of our members have a Vessel Safety Check performed each year. If you haven't had one done, maybe this is the year to add another item to your list. It doesn't cost you a penny. It is a free service provided by members of the US Coast Guard Auxiliary and the US Power Squadron.

If your vessel is less than 26 feet in length, there are maybe approximately 7 or 8 items that are needed to receive the inspection decal. It is a simple check and only takes less than half an hour. But, there are a few items you need to check prior that will otherwise cause you to fail. They are the Navigation Lights (red, green and the notorious white stern light that usually is not working because of a bad bulb or corrosion in the plug connection. Another item is the Fire Extinguisher expiration date. Not a frequent item but you need to check the date of manufacture and add 12 to it. State law nationwide is that the extinguisher has a 12 year life span.

Also, let's not forget the distress signals. Because our waters are tidal, we must have an onboard visual distress signal. You are required to have both day and nighttime signaling devices. So that date needs to be checked. In recent years, manufacturers have produced the "electronic" distress signal. When you purchase one, besides the distress signaling device, it will also be packaged with a distress flag. Light is for night time and the distress flag if for use during the day, All the items that are inspected can be found at this link Vessel Safety Check (VSC).
