PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello VHFC Members,

Well, we are just about at the midpoint of summer which is traditionally considered to be around August 1st although the official midpoint of summer is August 7 - halfway between the summer solstice and the fall equinox. But make no mistake about it, the days are getting shorter and the nights are getting longer, so get in all your favorite activities sooner than later!

As for fishing, fluking is the prime mid summer fishery and as I noted in last month's report, fluking in the inlets or on our reefs varies from bursts of outstanding to just okay. This past weekend, Little Egg Inlet had some notable catches and limits. The weekend of our tournament, Barnegat Inlet at the base of the lighthouse was loaded with boats catching good numbers of fluke with many keepers in the mix! There is no magic answer other than keep trying and enjoying being out on the water. I haven't heard of Blowfish being caught but that should happen very soon. Triggerfish are now in the mix and we even had two Kingfish entered but both were

caught offshore in deeper water instead of their usual residence in the suds. Stripers and Bluefish have been scarce of late but that can change quickly and no one in the club has reported catching Spanish Mackerel. Seabass reopened in July but finding a keeper among the hordes of shorts can be a daunting task. August 1 is the reopening of Tog and remains at one fish until November 16th! This year more than ever, we have a number of club members who are jumping on the Tuna bandwagon traveling some distances looking for a chance to battle one of these beasts. Also, do not forget about fishing from the beach, jetty or off the sod banks. Early morning or evening are great times to avoid the crowds, the heat and the badge checkers. And the entire beach is open to cast out a line, You just might be surprised at what you might hook!!

One final public announcement. Our VHFC account at TD Bank was hacked back in June with several bogus attempted money transfers. Despite getting new credit cards, Account Numbers, User IDs and Passwords, we were hacked again on Monday July 28th. The club never lost any money, but what a royal PITA going through the process of getting your laptop cleaned and verified before the bank will reopen our accounts. 

VHFC OPEN by John Stuebing - VHFC is planning a new tournament for August (8/18 – 8/24). However, as of this writing, we only have 13 people signed up and unless we get around 20 anglers, we may decide to cancel this event. Some details about the tournament below. This tournament will be different from what we have run in the past. We will be fishing for Fluke, Bluefish, Sea Bass, Blackfish and Tog. It will run for an entire week (7 days). Every angler can fish any two days of their choosing. All fish must be measured and a photo sent to Pat Presutto

and Ed Valitutto. **Only your largest fish, per species, per day will count.** Just like we do for the FOM's, the pictures must clearly show the total length of the fish or will be disqualified. All NJ fishing regulations apply as does the club's geographic boundaries. Anglers earn points for the most total inches by species. Winners are determined by total points across all species. Entry Fee will be \$20. Top three anglers will win a percentage of the pot (50%, 30%, 20%). Below is a look at how points are earned.

We will review the details again at the August Meeting. There will be a sign-up sheet available or contact John Stuebing (stuebs@comcast.net). Based on the response, I will make a GO NO/GO call.

NEW JERSEY REGULATORY NEWS by Phil Simon - Two big meetings are coming up in the next couple of weeks, each of which could ultimately affect our fishing regulations for 2026 and beyond. The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) meets August 5 – 7, and of main interest to us will be the discussion of the proposed Addendum III to the Fisheries Management Plan for Atlantic Striped Bass. This will be the first step in a series of meetings and sessions to deal with measures that may be taken to ensure that the recovery of the stock of Striped Bass by 2030 is achieved. The Science and Statistical Committee of the Striped Bass Management Board has determined that with the existing regulations we will not achieve with reasonable certainty that the required stock size will be achieved, and thus the board has created a set of options for reducing harvest, primarily by seasonal closures that reduce the number of days that we can fish for stripers. The draft addendum, if approved, would then be open for public comment through a series of open meetings with the public this Fall, and most likely would present options that we can support or not. Any new regulations would apply in 2026 and later. You can get the full agenda, meeting materials, and the link to register for attendance via video at the ASMFC meeting web page at [Summer Meeting 2025](#).

The second meeting is by our friends at the Mid Atlantic Fishery Management Council (MAFMC), which will be held August 11 through 14. There will be a number of sessions of interest to us, including the setting of specifications (i.e. catch targets) for Bluefish, Summer Flounder, Scup, and Black Sea Bass. As with the ASMFC meeting, the MAFMC meeting can be attended by video, and all the information and links can be found at [August 2025 Council Meeting](#). We need to be especially vigilant of the summer flounder numbers, where there is the risk of cuts to our future fishing seasons. We should also hope that the nonsense with the black sea bass regulations does not continue, and that at a minimum the status quo catch limits will continue. Better would be a decrease in the minimum sizes for the NE states, and an overall increase in the catch. All signs indicate that the Black Sea Bass stock is so big now that the fish are not finding enough to eat and their condition is deteriorating.

Still unclear to me is what the impact of the soon to be released (September?) data on the MRIP Fishing Effort Survey follow-up studies will have on all the decisions to be made at the two meetings. If it turns out that the earlier findings were correct that the MRIP process is significantly over-estimating the amount of recreational fishing effort, then it would seem that all

the specifications would have to be re-visited. We shall see. I think there will be strong political pressure from the commercial sector and their lobbyists to bury this under the rug, as more fish for us means less fish for them.

BARGE DEPLOYMENT ON LITTLE EGG REEF by Ed Valitutto - Thanks to a tip from Marty Friedrich, I contacted Capt John Lewis of the **Beach Haven Charter Fishing Association** regarding their **Jr Mate Reef Restoration Project** (Bill Figley Chairman) and found out that a 180' barge was deployed on Monday July 14th on Little Egg Reef. That is a massive new structure that will become home to many denizens of the deep. Capt Lewis provided the following coordinates of the drop: **N 39°28.251' W 74°11.407'**

Bill Figley provided the following additional coordinates of the barge and said the structure rose up 14' off the bottom:

TUNA TARTARE WITH WASABI & AVOCADO by Ed Valitutto - I haven't tried this recipe yet but I will make it early next week using Costco Tuna. It appeared recently in *On The Water* and looks easy and delicious.



OTW partnered with the MA Division of Marine Fisheries to bring you this inspiration. With its deep red color, rich flavor, and melt-in-your-mouth texture, Tuna shines best with just a hint of citrus, a dash of salt, and just enough heat to awaken your palate.

Ingredients *Serves 2–4 as an appetizer*

- 1/2 lb fresh, sushi-grade local Tuna
- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- Zest and juice of 1 lime
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons soy sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon wasabi powder
- 6 dashes hot sauce (Tabasco or your favorite)
- A few drops of sesame oil (to taste)
- 1 ripe avocado, diced
- 3 scallions, thinly sliced
- Toasted sesame seeds, for garnish

Instructions


1. Using a very sharp knife, cube the bluefin tuna into small, even pieces (about 1/4-inch cubes). Place in a mixing bowl with diced avocado and chopped scallions.
2. In a separate bowl, whisk together the olive oil, lime zest, lime juice, salt, soy sauce, wasabi powder, hot sauce, and sesame oil until well combined.
3. Pour the marinade over the tuna mixture and gently toss to coat. Taste and adjust seasoning as needed—add more lime or hot sauce if desired.
4. Spoon the tartare into chilled bowls or mold into rounds using a ring mold. Sprinkle with toasted sesame seeds and serve immediately with crisp wonton chips, seaweed snacks, cucumber slices or your favorite crackers.


And we forgot to measure for FOMs!


Tim Naples was out again for Tuna and caught 3 Yellowfin Tuna. The man can catch Tuna - he just can't remember to measure them for the FOM!
