PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello VHFC Members.

Wow! If I didn't know that it was physically impossible for time to go faster, I would swear each succeeding year seems to disappear faster than the previous one? Today is November 9th and Thanksgiving is two weeks from next Thursday! I don't even want to think about how fast the rest of 2025 will disappear with the holiday season activities to put an end to 2025 and usher in 2026! For now, let's forget about that and focus on the fall fishing season. Yes, the fall run of Striped Bass have grown weary of the northern Jersey anglers and have swum south into our area. In reading all the reports, talking with folks and remembering the last few years, it does seem about right for the arrival of our favorite game fish. Let's just hope that as they continue to arrive, the weather doesn't make it unfishable and the bass speed right on by!

In the meantime, there are Sea Bass, Blackfish, Porgies and the last of the Triggerfish to be caught. Perhaps a few more bluefish will make an appearance. This is also prime time for surf fishing on our scenic beaches which have taken a beating from the recent Nor'Easters. When the migrating stripers arrive in force - Captain Purul reports 30 - 40 lb fish just north of the inlet this week and a friend caught 15 over 40" on Spot at the north jetty - they should offer some

great fishing opportunities for those days when the waves & winds make boating difficult or you just prefer a few hours on the beach. The LBI Surf Fishing Tournament runs through 30 November and still has ample time for winning a nice prize. Additional details are provided later in the Newsletter.

Blackfish have been abundant off the Barnegat Light bulkhead and jetties with lots of shorts to devour your crabs and sand fleas. I have only caught one keeper despite many tries but have watched more keepers caught next to me by folks doing the same thing! As the waters cool, more Tog will show up and fishing will only get better. Tog is a one fish limit now but will increase to 5 fish on November 16.

Although Bluefish have been scarce, there are definitely a few in the inlet eagerly devouring expensive Spot like they were M&Ms. At least they only eat half! While folks wait for the ocean arrival of Striped Bass, do not overlook the inlet - especially the submerged rocks. Either use Spot or throw soft plastics, plugs or jigs. Sizes range from Bonus tag fish right through 'overs' like the 38" one I caught a week ago.

While many club members still have their boats in the water, there are plenty of alternatives if that is not an option. Party boats, charters and surf fishing offer great opportunities for having fun fishing in the fall. One of the best things about November fishing 'down the shore' is the lack of people and car / boat traffic. So make the most of it and enjoy this great time of year. As always, please be sure to share your reports for fellow club members. Hope to see you this Friday!

NEW JERSEY REGULATORY NEWS by Phil Simon - By now most of you know that we dodged a bullet on October 29 when the proposal brought forward by the Atlantic Striped Bass Management Board to introduce seasonal closures in 2026 was decisively shot down by the commissioners of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC). So, for next year we will have the same regulations as we had for 2025, which I guess is a victory. I did note that some of the commissioners are still in a panic over the status of the stock, pointing out that so far, the recreational catch of striped bass is down over 40% from last year, and that this could indicate that the size of the stock is significantly reduced from where we thought it is. I'm guessing that this commissioner does not actually fish, or he/she would have known that poor

weather has drastically reduced the number of good days to go out on the ocean. Just ask any of our charter boat captains, and they will tell you their trips are way down this year.

I've started a dialog with some of the commissioners concerning the practice of the Technical Committee (the number crunchers) using recreational catch numbers as an index of stock size, which in my opinion is a mistake. I would agree that over the long term catch and stock size (availability) are very highly correlated, all things (including fishing effort) being equal. But short-term factors such as weather disturb the equations. Add that to the flawed MRIP effort estimations, and I suspect that the numbers going into the computers are questionable. We shall see; a new Benchmark Stock Assessment is due to get underway in 2026 and the results will be seen in 2027.

One other observation on the ASMFC meeting, concerning proposals to reduce Menhaden commercial catch quotas by 50% for 2026 through 2028. Apparently up to now the Technical Committee has been using an incorrect number for its estimate of fishing mortality (termed F), and this led to what is now believed to be a significant over-estimation of the stock size. The so-called Ecosystem Approach to Fisheries Management requires that the Menhaden commercial catch be adjusted to ensure the continued support of the stocks that feed on them, especially Atlantic Striped Bass. The new calculations called for drastic cuts in the commercial catch. But when it came down to actually walking the talk, the Commission voted down the proposed reductions. They also voted down a proposed compromise to reduce the catch by 50% over three years and instead ended up reducing the 2026 catch by just 20%, thus kicking the can down the road for setting the catch for 2027 and 2028. So, the next time you hear someone claim that ecosystem-based management is being utilized in this fishery, you have permission to smirk.

Finally, we still await the final determinations for bag and size limits for our principal recreational fishing species, including Summer Flounder, Black Sea Bass, and Scup. As you may remember the harvest limits for 2026 for all three of these stocks were increased by the combined ASMFC and Mid Atlantic Marine Fisheries Council management board. However, the final numbers will be adjusted by the board using the Percent Change Approach, about which I have written negatively previously. We may find ourselves looking at no increases or even some reductions, as relayed to me by one of the Council staff members. So be prepared for lots more yelling and screaming (OK, some serious discussions) at the upcoming meetings through the late Fall and early Winter.

DREDGING NEWS - Article supplied by Mike Hanrahan & Jim Healy

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the Waretown Channel Complex dredging project is scheduled to begin this month in Barnegat Light Borough and Barnegat, Long Beach, Ocean and Lacey townships in Ocean County. The \$6.2 million project will restore channels to a safe navigable depth. NJDOT's contractor, JF Brennan, will dredge approximately 90,000 cubic yards of fine sand and silt from multiple channels within the Waretown Channel Complex.

The following eight channels serve emergency services, commercial fisheries, marinas, homeowners and recreational boaters:

- Holiday Harbor Skippers Cove Waretown Creek South Harbor
- Double Creek Mainland Double Creek High Bar Harbor Barnegat Light Stake

The project will restore safe navigation by dredging the channels to their appropriate depths, between six and nine feet. The public is advised to use caution when boating in the area. Dredging operations are scheduled to begin this month and are expected to be completed in December 2025. Work will be conducted 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The area is expected to remain open throughout the duration of the project. All material removed from the channels will be transported via pipeline and discharged into the Oyster Creek Confined Disposal Facility. The pipeline will be clearly marked with buoys and lights for safe navigation. Channel closures are not expected, but if they are needed, closures will be communicated through the Local Notice to Mariners. State Aids to Navigation (ATON) will be removed as necessary for the duration of the project.

The public is advised to be aware of and stay alert for the pipeline, buoys, dredge, and other maritime construction equipment during the project. NJDOT asks that no one enter the construction areas nor approach project-related equipment (including dredges). Boaters should proceed through dredging and construction zones with caution and can contact the contractor for passing arrangements on Channel 4. No wake speed should be observed in active work zones.



SOME GOOD NEWS by Chuck Dishian - As reported at the May meeting, the US Coast Guard proposed a discontinuation of 350 marker buoys in an effort to "bring navigational safety into the 21st century" by placing more reliance on global satellite navigation systems, electronic navigation charts and electronic charting systems". The prevailing thinking was that the real reason for this transition is due to the cost of maintenance of the marker buoys. The Coast Guard sought public input on this transition. Well, the public has spoken. The plan faced overwhelming opposition from mariners, harbormasters, local officials and fishing clubs who argued the buoys are vital for safety, especially in poor visibility conditions or when electronic systems fail which we all know never happens!. As a result, the Coast Guard has suspended the proposed removal of these buoys largely due to public pressure in the form of over 3500 responses by such groups as the JCAA and by extension US!

MEDITERRANEAN ROASTED TAUTOG by Ed Valitutto I saw this recipe while searching online and thought it would be perfect for this time of year. It was created for an episode of *My Fishing Cape Cod TV* and the reviews were all raves! Tautog is simmered and roasted in a Mediterranean style sauce of freshly chopped tomatoes, spices, herbs, capers and golden raisins. According to the author, this recipe also works for halibut, cod, swordfish, striped bass,

bluefish, shrimp or chicken, so even if you don't catch a keeper tog, you can still enjoy this



delicious dish. Ingredients

1 lb tautog (or any firm white fish like halibut, swordfish or striped bass)

2 TBS olive oil

1/4 C diced red onion

2 large firm tomatoes chopped or substitute 1 cup drained canned tomatoes

8 garlic cloves, minced

1 tsp coriander, 1 tsp paprika & 1 tsp cumin

1 TBS capers, drained

1/4 C golden raisins

1/4 C broth (chicken, vegetable, drained tomato juice or white wine)

Zest of 1/2 lemon

Juice of 1 lemon

Chopped fresh flat leaf parsley for garnish

Optional - a few chopped hot peppers or some hot sauce (Ed's idea!)

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400.
- 2. Heat olive oil in a large oven safe skillet, then add onion, sauteeing for 3 minutes, or until the onion turns golden in color. Next add in the tomatoes, garlic, coriander, paprika, cumin, capers, a pinch of salt and pepper and the raisins. Bring to a low simmer and cook, stirring occasionally until the sauce cooks down, then add in the broth to loosen up the sauce. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 3. Pat the fish filets dry and season with salt and pepper. Tuck the fish into the sauce and spoon some of the sauce over the fish. Sprinkle the fish with the lemon zest and pour the lemon juice over the fish. Transfer to the oven and let the fish cook for 15 18 minutes, or until cooked through. Garnish with parsley and enjoy

Serve over rice with crusty bread to sop up all that delicious sauce along with a glass of your favorite chilled Sauvignon Blanc or Chardonnay!


