Strategy & Rules

Designed to level the playing field between Surf, Boat, Kayak fishermen

- Every type of fishing will have its Advantages and Disadvantages
- Select any two days to fish, and you can pick your days up to the morning of the day you are going to fish. Send an e-mail, text or call to John S. or Pat P.
- The goal is to get as many inches for each species over a two-day period. Points will be awarded based on the total inches for each species
- Any angler can fish by boat **and/or** surf on any of their two days
- Cannot exceed or be under NJ size regulations on any one day. All fish must be legal. **Tie Breaker** will be determined by largest single Bluefish in inches. Second tie breaker will be largest single Fluke in inches.
- **Surf Fisherman:**
 - You can fish from the Surf, Jetty, Piers, Sod Banks, etc.
 - If fishing on a Jetty, you must stay inside the shoreline
- **Boat, Kayak Fisherman:**
 - You can fish the Bays, Tributaries, Creeks, etc.
 - You **cannot** fish in or outside any Inlet. Boundaries will be explained
- **For Everyone:** You must send your pictures on the day you fished or the next morning by 8:00AM – No exceptions!

Surf & Boat Fisherman may want to Buddy up!
Fish a day from Boat and a day from the Surf

Tactic Tip

Weakfish could be the spoiler

Strategy & Rules

- Surf Fisherman Advantage:
 - Better access to Bluefish and Striper in the surf
 - Can fish Inlet Structure within casting range
- Surf Fisherman Disadvantage:
 - Not as mobile
 - Less access to Fluke, Weakfish
 - Limited by casting range

- Boat Fisherman Advantage:
 - Better access to Fluke and Weakfish
 - Better mobility
 - Can use anchor and chum tactic
 - Can use trolling as a tactic
- Boat Fisherman Disadvantage
 - Cannot fish in any inlet
 - Eliminates the Inlet Structure
 - Less access to Striper & Bluefish

Let's define the Inlets and Boundaries:

- Barnegat inlet. Boaters cannot fish past the Light House and a line 90° to IBSP
- Little Egg Inlet: Boaters cannot fish past a line from the inside of Holgate to "123" Bouy to the entrance of Grassy Channel where it meets Little Beach.
- Manasquan Inlet: Boaters cannot fish past a line from Loughron Point to the SW corner of the Manasquan Public parking Lot. Surf Fisherman cannot use the North Jetty
- Club Boundary Rules apply
